ELECTION OF A MEMBER OF THE SUB-COMMISSION ON PREVENTION
OF DISCRIMINATION AND PROTECTION OF MINORITIES
TO FILL A VACANCY

Note by the Secretary-General

1. At its eighteenth session the Commission elected fourteen persons as members of the Sub-Commission on Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities for a three-year term ending 31 December 1965.
2. Mr. Charles Amoun of Lebanon, a member of the Sub-Commission, died on 8 January 1963. The Commission may wish to elect a new member for the remainder of Mr. Amoun's term of office.
3. The Secretary-General has invited States Members of the United Nations to nominate candidates to fill the vacancy. He has received the following communication from the United Arab Republic:

"The Permanent Representative of the United Arab Republic presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and ... has the honour to inform him that the Government of the United Arab Republic is proposing the candidature of Dr. Mohammed Awad Mohammed ... MOHAMMED AWAD MOHAMMED, born 1900. Professor of Ethnography and Human Geography, former Rector of the University of Alexandria; Member of the Egyptian Delegation to the San Francisco Conference of the United Nations in 1945; one-time Head of the Department of Social Sciences at UNESCO; former Minister of Education in Cairo; member of the Sub-Commission on Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities from 1954 to 1959, its Vice-Chairman from 1954 to 1956 and Chairman from 1957 to 1959; President of the Executive Board of UNESCO from 1959 to 1962."
