The situation in Côte d'Ivoire

Nineteenth progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations
Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (S/2009/21)

The meeting was called to order at 3.10 p.m.

Expression of welcome to the new Permanent Representative of Uganda to the United Nations

The President (*spoke in French*): At the outset of this meeting, I should like, on behalf of the Council, to extend a warm welcome to our new colleague, Ambassador Ruhakana Rugunda, Permanent Representative of Uganda to the United Nations. We are pleased to welcome him to our small family and look forward to working closely with him.

Adoption of the agenda

The agenda was adopted.

The situation in Côte d'Ivoire

Nineteenth progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (S/2009/21)

The President (*spoke in French*): I propose, with the consent of the Council, to invite the representative of Côte d'Ivoire to participate in the consideration of the item on the Council's agenda, without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

At the invitation of the President, Mr. Djédjé (Côte d'Ivoire) took a seat at the Council table.

The President (*spoke in French*): The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2009/49, which contains the text of a draft resolution submitted by France. Members also have before them document S/2009/21, which contains the nineteenth progress report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall now put the draft resolution to the vote.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Austria, Burkina Faso, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, France, Japan, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mexico, Russian Federation, Turkey, Uganda, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Viet Nam.

The President (*spoke in French*): There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1865 (2009).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Council will remain seized of the matter.
