Note by the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. As indicated in paragraph 5 of the note by the Secretary-General (A/44/106), the term of office of five members of the International Civil Service Commission will expire on 30 December 1989 and it will be necessary for the General Assembly at its forty-fourth session to appoint five persons to fill the resulting vacancies.
2. The procedures to be followed are specified in articles 2 to 4 of the Statute of the Commission (see A/44/106, para. 2). Article 4 calls for the compilation by the Secretary-General, in his capacity as Chairman of the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination, of a list of candidates after appropriate consultations with Member States, with the Executive Heads of other organizations of the United Nations common system and with staff representatives.
3. The General Assembly, in paragraph 3 of section II of its resolution 43/226 of 21 December 1988, requested the Secretary-General, in the context of article 4 of the statute of the Commission, to propose to the General Assembly an appropriate deadline for the submission of candidatures for appointment to the Commission so as to allow for full and timely consultations with the three parties concerned.

4. In paragraph 4 of section II of the same resolution, the Assembly also requested the Secretary-General, in his report to be submitted to it at its forty-fourth session, to reflect the views resulting from the consultations referred to in paragraph 3 above.

5. In order to allow for full and timely consultations with the three parties concerned, as envisaged under article 4 of the Commission's statute, the Secretary-General would propose that a deadline of 15 October 1989 be established for the submission of candidatures for the five vacancies mentioned in paragraph 1 above.

6. Following the consultations mandated in article 4 of the statute of the Commission, it is the intention of the Secretary-General, in his report to the General Assembly, to reflect the views resulting from these consultations.
