#### The situation in Timor-Leste

### **Report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Integrated Mission in Timor-Leste** (S/2009/72)

**The President**: Pursuant to the decision taken at the 6085th meeting of the Security Council, I invite the representative of Timor-Leste to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

I should also like to inform the Council that I have received letters from the representatives of Australia, Malaysia, New Zealand and Portugal, in which they request to be invited to participate in the consideration of the item on the Council's agenda. In conformity with the usual practice, I propose, with the consent of the Council, to invite those representatives to participate in the consideration of the item without the right to vote, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter and rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

At the invitation of the President, the representatives of the aforementioned countries took the seats reserved for them at the side of the Council Chamber. **The President**: The Security Council will now continue its consideration of the item on its agenda.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2009/111, which contains the text of a draft resolution submitted by Australia, France, Japan, Malaysia, New Zealand, Portugal, Turkey, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America. Members of the Council also have before them document S/2009/72, which contains the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Integrated Mission in Timor-Leste.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to the vote on the draft resolution before it. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Austria, Burkina Faso, China, Costa Rica, Croatia, France, Japan, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mexico, Russian Federation, Turkey, Uganda, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Viet Nam

**The President**: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1867 (2009).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.

The meeting rose at 10.10 a.m.
