Section 2.E. UNITED NATIONS RELIEF AND WORKS AGENCY FOR PALESTINE  
REFUGEES IN THE NEAR EAST

The previous programme performance report (A/37/154) indicated that the services rendered by the Agency could not be programmed with any degree of accuracy. The figures shown in the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1982-1983 are only indicative. They are based on the experience gained over the years, but the actual cases depend on emergency situations. Consequently, deviations between what was programmed and what was implemented have to be expected. It follows that the standard method of calculating the percentage of implementation cannot meaningfully apply to this programme.

The Statistical Office provides special statistical tables, computer tapes and microfiches on request. During the 1982-1983 biennium, the Office provided 360 related to international trade statistics, 145 related to energy statistics and 144 related to social demographic statistics.

6. Programme planning and co-ordination

The Development Information System, established pursuant to General Assembly resolution 36/237, produced 12 issues of the bimonthly publication Development Information Abstracts, distributed 2,500 copies of United Nations documents, provided on request 2,300 specialized bibliographic searches to governments, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations and prepared 6 copies of the complete data base on magnetic tape.

4. Population (programme element 1.1)

Award of 230 fellowships (200 programmed) for training in population institutions and at the three United Nations supported interregional population training centres and programmes in Bucharest, Cairo and Moscow.

As can be seen in table 7.1, one programme had an implementation rating of "D". The following explanation is provided for the departure from programmed commitments:

Programme 1: Development issues and policies (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 7.18), percentage implementation for the programme, excluding technical assistance, D.

Postponement (1): Implementation of programme element 1.2, Analysis of the United Nations Technical Co-operation activities in economic and social development planning and plan implementation, was postponed due to staff shortage brought about by reduction in posts and freezing of recruitment for the Department.

As can be seen in table 11.1, four programmes had a "C" rating. The following explanations are provided for the departures from programmed commitments in these programmes:

Programme 4. Human Settlements (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 11.37), percentage implementation for the programme, excluding technical assistance, C.

Reformulations (2): Under programme element 1.1, output (ii)(a) was reformulated to provide for a publication on the physical profile of cities in the ESCAP region. Under programme element 1.5, output (iii) was reformulated to provide a report to the seventh session of the Committee on Industry, Technology, Human Settlements and the Environment on urban land policies: focus on land for housing the poor.

Postponements (13): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1(iv), 1.4(iii), 1.5(ii) and 1.7(a) had to be postponed due to the unavailability of anticipated extrabudgetary funds and will be implemented during the 1984-1985 biennium subject to availability of funding. Under programme element 1.7, the issuance of publications listed as output (b) had to be postponed to 1984.

Terminations (3): Under programme element 1.2, the convening of an intergovernmental meeting of experts on the finance and management of human settlements planned for 1983 was considered premature; instead, the Commission has included an expert group meeting on the same topic in the 1984-1985 programme of work. Under programme element 1.4 output (i), the study on methods, costs and techniques of low-cost housing was terminated for lack of country interest. However, in view of recent developments and a revival of interest, related outputs are foreseen in subprogramme 2 of the 1984-1985 programme budget (see A/38/66, vol. II, para. 11.33).

Programme 8. Population (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 11.63), percentage implementation for technical assistance activities, C.

Reformulations (1): Under programme element 1.1, output (vi) was reformulated due to constraints in extrabudgetary funding; instead of organizing a workshop, a technical publication was prepared on integration of population, resources, environment and development: experiences in the ESCAP region.

Postponements (9): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1(ii), 1.1(iii) and 1.1(viii) had to be postponed due the unavailability of anticipated extrabudgetary funds and will be implemented during the 1984-1985 biennium subject to the availability of funding. Under programme element 3.1, output (iii) has been postponed to 1984.

Terminations (22): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1(iii), 1.1(iv), 1.1(v), 1.1(vii), 1.2(iv), 1.2(vi) and 3.1(iv) were terminated due to a shortfall of the anticipated extrabudgetary resources.

Additional output (2): The following non-programmed activities were carried out at the initiative of the secretariat: technical assistance on request to the Republic of Korea and to the ASEAN countries relating to the analysis of census data and the design of surveys on migration.

Programme 10. Statistics (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 11.73), percentage implementation for technical assistance activities, C.

Reformulations (5): Under programme element 1.2, output (ii) was reformulated to promote a training course on sampling and household survey methodology instead of four separate missions. Under programme element 1.3, output (viii) was reformulated to provide for a Pacific subregional workshop on price statistics.

Postponements (20): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.3(i) and (ii), 1.4(i)(a), (b) and (c) and 1.5(i)(a) had to be postponed due to the unavailability of anticipated extrabudgetary funds and will be implemented during the 1984-1985 biennium subject to the availability of funding.

Terminations (55): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1(i), 1.2(i) and (ii), 1.3(vi) and (ix), 1.4(ii)(a) and (b) and 1.5(i)(b) were terminated due to a shortfall of anticipated extrabudgetary resources.

Additional output (32): The following non-programmed activities were carried out as required by additional legislative mandates (10): four advisory missions to Afghanistan and Bhutan on general statistical development and organization; training course on electronic data processing; Pacific subregional workshop on energy statistics; expert group meeting on training courses in energy statistics; regional training course on energy statistics; working group on evaluation and utilization of population and housing census data; and Pacific workshop on household surveys. The following non-programmed activities were carried out at the initiative of the secretariat (22): two advisory missions to Viet Nam and Sri Lanka on general statistical organization and development; two advisory missions on matters pertaining to national accounts; and 18 advisory missions concerning various aspects of population and housing censuses.

Programme 12. Transport II: Shipping, ports and inland waterways (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 11.85), percentage implementation for the programme, excluding technical assistance activities, C.

Reformulations (7): Under programme element 1.1, output (ii)(a), the technical publication on maritime curricula for management trainees in shipping was reformulated to the holding of a seminar on seafarer's training and certification. Under programme element 1.4, output (ii)(a) a technical publication on training and upgrading of freight forwarders' organizations was reformulated to a seminar on freight forwarding. Under output (ii)(b) of the same programme element, a workshop on currency fluctuations and a seminar for the Federation of ASEAN Shippers' Councils on freight rates were organized instead of a technical publication on freight rates, surcharges and other conditions of ocean transport of major commodities. Under programme element 1.5, output (i), two workshops were reformulated; one seminar on dredging and three advisory missions on the same subject were carried out. Under the same programme element, output (ii)(c), two seminars on port containerization were held instead of the programmed reports on the subject.

Postponements (9): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1(ii)(a), 1.1(v), 1.6(e), 2.1(iii), 2.3, 2.4(i) and 2.5(a) and (d) were postponed to 1984 due to the unavailability of extrabudgetary resources.

Terminations (24): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.5(i), 1.5(ii)(a) and (b), 1.5(iv), 2.2, 2.3 and 2.5(b), (c) and (d) were terminated due to a shortfall of anticipated extrabudgetary resources.

In addition to the above final outputs ECLA has prepared computer printouts of bibliographic searches of the continually updated CELADE/DOCPAL data base, country bibliographies answering 500 requests per year as well as computer tapes of the CELADE/DOCPAL Spanish language population thesaurus and other materials. In addition ECLA has provided fellowships to 200 government officials for training in statistical methods during the biennium.

Table 12.1 shows an implementation rate of "C" for one programme. The following explanations are provided for the departures from programmed commitments:

Programme 12. Statistics (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 12.85)

(a) Percentage implementation for the programme, excluding technical assistance, C:

Reformulation (1): Under programme element 1.3, the study on the measurement of employment and situations of underemployment in Latin America was prepared and included as a separate chapter of document E/CEPAL/G.1226.

Postponements (12): Under programme element 1.1, the 1982 and 1983 issues of the Statistical Yearbook for Latin America were merged; the work was finalized at the end of 1983 but for editorial reasons the Yearbook will not be published until 1984. Due to the lack of staff and financial resources, the following outputs had to be postponed to the next biennium: the four technical publications under programme element 1.2, the sales publication on indicators of social development in Latin America under programme element 1.3, the two technical publications and the two sales publications under programme element 1.4 and one of the sales publications under programme element 1.6.

Terminations (6): Preparation of the six issues of the Bulletin on Census Activities under programme element 2.4 was terminated owing to the lack of the extrabudgetary resources.

Additional output added at the initiatives of the secretariat (6): Under programme element 1.1, a document on input-output tables was prepared (E/CEPAL/G.1218). Under programme element 1.2, a report entitled "The Impact of the Latin American Crisis on Living Conditions" was prepared for UNICEF. Under programme element 1.3, a report entitled "Dinámica de la población activa en América Latina, 1950-1980" was prepared and submitted to the Latin American Congress on Population and Development, and one regional workshop on measurement of rural employment and income was held at Ixtapan de la Sal, Mexico, from 24 to 28 May 1982. Under programme element 1.5, one document was prepared (E/CEPAL/R.338), and one seminar on household surveys was held in Santiago, Chile, from 22 to 24 September 1982.

(b) Percentage implementation for technical assistance activities C:

Postponements (4): Due to a lack of staff and financial resources, the following four regional seminars and/or workshops under output 2.2 (ii) could not be held: (b) industrial statistics, (d) measurement of living standards, (e) methods of income and expenditure survey, and (f) development and use of social indicators.

Terminations (41): Of the 80 missions of advisory services envisaged for the 1982-1983 biennium under programme element 2.1, 39 missions have been undertaken.

- 1.4 (i) Placement of 450 fellows (500 programmed) in pre-service and in-service training programmes.

8. Natural resources and energy:

- 3.6 Of the approximately 24 scholarships programmed per year for technicians/engineers/researchers in the field of solar energy only 13 have been awarded owing to insufficiency of applications.

9. Population:

- 3.1 (ii) Award of 150 fellowships (as programmed) to officials from countries for training in population studies.

10. Public administration and finance:

- 1.2 (i) Training in the management and operational efficiency of public enterprises was provided to a total of 220 participants (80 programmed and 140 added at the initiative of the secretariat) to satisfy increased demands from member States utilizing, in part, resources provided by participating member States.

- 1.2 (ii) Of the 250 persons programmed to participate in training in the techniques of efficient and effective procurement and supply management, 80 persons participated during the biennium; the participation of the remaining 170 persons was postponed because of the separation from service of the project officer concerned at the end of 1982.

12. Social development and humanitarian affairs:

- 3.3 (viii) Of the 60 programmed internships, fellowships and scholarships to develop technical capabilities of women in Africa, 54 were implemented.

As can be seen in table 13.1, one programme had an implementation rating of "C". The following explanations are provided for the departures from programme commitments:

/...

Programme 8. Natural resources and energy (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 13.46), percentage implementation for the programme, excluding technical assistance, C.

Postponements (17): The four technical publications under programme element 1.2 were postponed owing to lack of approval by UNDP of financing for the project. For programme element 1.3, preliminary contacts with UNESCO were made in 1983 and project document of co-operation between ECA and UNESCO is under preparation for implementation in 1984. Under programme element 1.4, preliminary negotiations to investigate the need to establish a mineral resources development centre in West Africa could not be undertaken due to a lack of response from countries expected to take part in the discussions; a second attempt is scheduled for early 1984. The technical publication on arid zones in Africa under programme element 2.2 has been completed in draft form and the final report will be issued in 1984. Under programme element 2.7, the technical publication on the development of Lake Tanganyika basin has not been completed due to vacancy in the Water Resources Unit and the secondment of a staff member to the Niamey-based MULPOC. Under programme element 3.2, information on solar, wind and biomass conversion equipment in Africa has been collected but the issuance of the publication was delayed owing to lack of time. Part of the information for the five outputs on electrical energy development under programme element 3.3 has been collected, but collection of further information was delayed due to the vacancy situation in the unit of up to 14 months. Most of the information for the atlas showing all energy resources that can be recorded on a map, under programme element 3.4 output (i) has been collected, but printing was delayed due to lack of resources and a publisher. The two outputs under programme element 4.6 were postponed for lack of resources and, in the case of the directory, also because of lack of response from member States.

Terminations (7): Due to lack of political and financial support for existing multinational institutes, no new multinational institutes will be created at this time (see E/CN.14/781/Add.1, para. 290 (iii)); hence, programme element 2.4 was terminated, as indicated in annex XI of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985 (A/38/6). Under programme element 2.6, 6 of the 10 technical publications on land and water resources surveys have been terminated since only one half of the expected extrabudgetary resources was received.

Additional output required by legislation (5): Under programme element 1.2, three additional outputs were published: a geological map of Africa, a mineral resources map of Africa and an oil and gas map of Africa. Under programme element 1.4 one output was added: proceedings of the First Regional Conference on Development and Utilization of Mineral Resources in Africa. Under programme element 1.5 one output was added: study tour to Latin America by African mineral development experts.

Additional output added at the initiative of the secretariat (1): Under programme element 3.4 one output was added: primary energy map of Africa.

As can be seen in table 14.1, five programmes had a "C" or "D" rating. The following explanations are provided for the departures from programmed commitments:

Programme 3. Human settlements (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 14.25), percentage implementation for the programme, excluding technical assistance, D.

Reformulations (1): Under programme element 1.3, the collection of data pertaining to consumption, production, import and export of building materials for each ECWA country was reformulated and reduced in scope due to a high vacancy rate under this programme.

Postponements (6): Under programme element 1.2, six sales publications on human settlements country profiles had to be postponed to the 1984-1985 biennium due to the unavailability of staff resources resulting from a high vacancy rate.

Terminations (3): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1, 1.4 and 1.5 were terminated in accordance with General Assembly resolution 37/242 (see A/38/6, annex XI).

Programme 4. Industrial development (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 14.29), percentage implementation for the programme C.

Postponement (1): Under programme element 2.1, a technical publication in the series Development of Selected Industrial Branches in the ECWA Region had to be postponed to the 1984-1985 biennium due to the unavailability of staff resources resulting from a high vacancy rate; it will also be reformulated in the new biennium due to a lack of sufficiently detailed data required for the initial concept.

Terminations (8): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1, 2.2, 3.1 and 3.2 were terminated due to the unavailability of staff resources resulting from a high vacancy rate. Programme element 2.3 was terminated due to the unavailability of anticipated extrabudgetary funds.

Additional outputs (2): A report entitled "Technology and process design update: petroleum-based industries" and a report on a symposium on plastic technologies, both submitted to the Commission, were prepared, as foreseen in the proposed medium-term plan for the period 1980-1983 (see A/33/6/Rev.1, vol. III, para. 17.343-17.354).

Programme 6. Labour management and employment (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 14.38), percentage implementation for the programme D.

Terminations (3): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.1 and 1.2 were terminated due to the unavailability of staff resources resulting from a 100 per cent vacancy rate under this programme.

/...

Programme 8. Population (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 14.51),  
percentage implementation for the programme C.

Reformulations (2): Under programme element 3.1 the planned two issues of the Population Bulletin of ECWA were published in one volume due to resource constraints.

Postponements (5): Planned outputs under programme elements 1.3, 2.2 and 3.1 were postponed to the 1984-1985 biennium due to the unavailability of staff resources resulting from a high vacancy rate. The planned output under programme element 1.3 was postponed to the next biennium due to difficulties encountered in hiring a consultant.

Terminations (6): Under programme element 1.1, two technical publications on a comparative study of data collection systems in the ECWA region and a methodology of intraregional migration were terminated in order to avoid duplication of work following the centralization of statistical activities under the Statistics programme; accordingly, a post was redeployed from Population to Statistics. One of two programmed reports to the Commission on the implementation of the census of the Palestinian Arab people under programme element 1.2 was terminated in response to ECWA resolution 109 (IX) and because UNFPA withdrew its contribution to this project. Planned outputs under programme elements 2.1 and 2.2 were terminated due to the unavailability of staff resources resulting from a high vacancy rate. The planned output under programme element 3.2 was terminated because only minor changes occurred since the first issuance of the Source Book.

Additional outputs (3): Population Bulletin No. 21, carried over from the previous biennium, was completed. Two publications carried forward from the 1980-1981 programme of work, "Population and Development in the Middle East", and "A Guide for Arab Students and Researchers in the Field of Population", were prepared.

Programme 11. Social development (A/36/6, vol. I, para. 14.65),  
percentage implementation for the programme,  
excluding technical assistance, C.

Postponements (2): Outputs under programme element 2.1 were postponed due to the rescheduling of the intergovernmental meeting in 1984 in order to correspond with the preparatory activities for the World Conference to Review and Appraise the Achievements of the United Nations Decade for Women, to be held in 1985.

Termination (2): Planned outputs under programme element 1.1 were terminated due to the unavailability of staff resources.

Additional output (1): A report to the Commission, the "General study of the economic and social situation and potential of the Palestinian Arab people", carried over from the programme budget 1980-1981 was prepared.

In addition to the above final outputs, UNIDO completed the following activities: 121 project formulation and review missions as part of UNIDO participation in the development of country programmes; 162 field project evaluation reports; analysis of 480 Junior Professional Officer/Senior Industrial Development Field Adviser reports; distribution of 500 computer printouts containing techno-economic data on selected industrial sectors; response to 3,000 requests for processed information under the services of the Industrial and Technological Information Bank; award of 2,400 fellowships and study tours to participants from developing countries to upgrade their technical and managerial skills; formulation of 870 new industrial project proposals in a format suitable for presentation to joint venture partners; and 111 industrial project proposals to joint venture negotiations or agreements.

As can be seen in table 17.1, one programme had a rating "C". The following explanations are provided for the departures from programmed commitments:

Programme 2: Industrial studies and research (A/36/6, vol. II, para. 17.41), percentage implementation for technical assistance C.

Postponements (45): Programme element 4.3, Technology research, development and adaptation, output (iv): the award of 4 fellowships was postponed due to lack of suitable candidates. Programme element 5.1, Short-term technological advisory services: 2 out of the 20 programmed advisory assignments were not undertaken. Programme element 5.2, Measures to assist developing countries in the acquisition of technology and the negotiation of technology contracts, output (iii): 1 out of 4 training workshops had to be postponed due to lack of extrabudgetary funds to complement activities financed out of the regular budget. Programme element 6.1, Establishment of Industrial and Technological Information Bank (INTIB) networking system and generation and dissemination of technological information by INTIB, output (v): the provision of 50 technology information packages was programmed, but only 12 were requested by developing countries.

## Section 27. PUBLIC INFORMATION

The Department of Public Information programme performance report for 1980-1981 was submitted to the Committee for Programme and Co-ordination (CPC) at its twenty-second session in a different format in order to present a detailed account of the Department's activities and outputs in response to comments and recommendations made by CPC and the Committee on Information. It was determined at the time that the standard format presented in the past (by organizational unit rather than by objective) did not lend itself to the kind of detailed reporting requested by CPC and the Committee on Information, and a different form of presentation was therefore adopted (see A/37/154, sect. 27, Public information).

A programme performance report in this new format is presented in annex II, in order to provide more details on the activities of the Department, including the performance of the United Nations Information Centres.

Considering that the budget proposals for the biennium 1984-1985 of the Department are presented by thematic categories, the programme performance report for 1984-1985 will once again be in the 1980-1981 format.

The present report is formulated along the four subprogrammes: \* (a) coverage, (b) information in depth, (c) dissemination and (d) system-wide co-operation; the four organizational units of the Department plus United Nations Information Service/Geneva contributed to each of the four subprogrammes from their respective areas of information work. In the 1982-1983 programme budget, the public information programme was presented by the organizational units, the four Divisions and Geneva, so that each of the five units contain the descriptions of the relevant parts of the four subprogrammes which fall within its responsibility. The presentation of the following programme performance information is organized accordingly.

However, the programme narrative in the 1982-1983 budget did not, in the majority of cases, provide adequate quantifiable information on the programme element level about the planned output. That data, now available to the Department through its monitoring system, has been reported between brackets.

In addition, during the biennium, the Department provided extensive coverage for the following major United Nations conferences:

The following explanations are provided for the departures from programmed commitments as indicated in table 29.A.1:

The operations of conference services do not constitute, in strict programme budgeting terms, an integrated programme; they are, however, an integral and indispensable component of every major programme of the Organization. Meetings services, documentation services and library services are provided in response to the needs of the intergovernmental organs and subsidiary bodies and of the substantive departments. Thus, to a large extent, neither the volume nor the timing of the work is controlled or programmed by the organizational unit responsible for its completion.

Variations between the estimated work-load shown in the programme budget and the actual work-load performed during the biennium are to be expected since the calendar of conferences for the biennium is not finalized until after the preparation of these estimates. Certain bodies, such as the General Assembly, meet in regular session according to a timetable which is sufficiently well known in advance and others, such as the Security Council, are empowered to meet whenever necessary. The scheduling by the Committee on Conferences of many other meetings and conferences only takes place in the year preceding the biennium in question and, to a significant extent, even during the course of the biennium. Consequently, estimation of the work-load is necessarily based on past trends and experience and not on a well defined work programme. In some cases there are cancellations, postponements and changes in conference-servicing requirements after the calendar of conferences is approved, which may have a considerable impact on the work-load performance.

With regard to contractual typing, the practice in the past was to attempt to clean type internally most documents or publications that had been translated contractually. However, because the work-load and capacity of the translation services and typing units are closely matched, when the former are overburdened so are the latter. Therefore, that practice frequently led to long delays in the typing of contractually translated texts. To avoid these, most texts translated contractually are now also typed externally immediately afterwards. This has considerably expedited the processing of many publications.

In addition, at some points in the biennium, unexpected backlogs of meetings' records developed and were dealt with through contractual typing.

The following explanations are provided for the departures from programmed commitments as indicated in table 29.B.1:

The difference between the actual and anticipated workload of interpreter assignments, based on the approved programme of conference and meetings, is due to changes and cancellations in the UNCTAD programme of meetings. Besides the changes in the language combination of meetings (from conversion of plenary bodies into negotiating, regional groupings), there have been outright cancellations of meetings, without the possibility of cancelling contracts already established.

The exchanges of interpreters between the United Nations Office at Geneva and Headquarters and United Nations agencies have been maintained to the utmost during slack periods to ensure maximum utilization of the staffing resources available to the Organization.

The difference in the figure for actual reproduction compared with that projected can be largely attributed to efforts within the United Nations Office at Geneva to reduce press runs of documents. Further, the increase in the number of Arabic documents (with their typically low press runs) has affected the total number of copies produced.

ANNEX II

Section 27, Public information, programme performance for the biennium 1982-1983 presented in terms of objectives

1. The format of the programme performance report on the activities of the Department of Public Information for the biennium 1980-1981 presented details on activities and outputs of the Department in response to comments and recommendations made by CPC and by the Committee on Information.

2. In the present annex, the format has been further modified in order to provide more details on the activities of the Department, including the performance by information centres. The data is compiled from monitoring reports based on responses to forms which the Department introduced in September 1982. The data for information centres covers the period September 1982-December 1983. Responses from centres vary in their regularity. Most sent in data for every one of the five quarters covered, others responded once or twice, accounting for some differences in the statistics.

3. As in the previous report, quantifiable outputs of the Department are presented in line with priorities established by the General Assembly in its resolution 35/201. Those activities that are relevant to more than one category have been placed in a separate category called "Multisubject".

4. During the biennium, DPI provided extensive coverage for the following major United Nations conferences:

- World Assembly on Aging, Vienna, 26 July-6 August 1982
- Second United Nations Conference on the Exploration and Peaceful Uses of Outer Space, Vienna, 9-21 August 1982
- Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea, Kingston, Jamaica, 6-10 December 1982
- International Conference in Support of the Struggle of the Namibian People for Independence, Paris, 25-29 April 1983
- Sixth session of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, Belgrade, 6-30 June 1983
- Second World Conference to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination, Geneva, 1-12 August 1983
- International Conference on the Question of Palestine, Geneva, 29 August-7 September 1983

5. Also during the biennium, two annual conferences for non-governmental organizations were held by the Department. In 1982, 738 representatives of non-governmental organizations from 38 countries attended the conference "Spears or Pruning Hooks? The Impact of the Arms Race on Society" (8-10 September 1982). In 1983, over 600 representatives from 39 countries examined the issues to be taken up at the national level for the International Youth Year (13-15 September 1983).

6. The following extrabudgetary activities were carried out by the Department during the biennium:

(a) Mass Media Leaders' Roundtables were held from 7-9 February 1982 at Budapest; 25-26 February 1982, at Bangkok; 6-7 May 1982, at Arusha; 24-26 March 1983 at Santiago; and 12-14 May 1983, at Manila. Also during the biennium, two editors' seminars were held at the United Nations by the United Nations Association of the United States of America (UNA/USA) from 20-21 September 1982 and 19-20 September 1983. Over 130 editors, writers, radio and television newscasters and magazine writers participated in each meeting. Editors' seminars were also organized by UNA/USA in co-operation with DPI in Boston on 15-16 November 1982 and in San Francisco on 18-19 November 1982.

(b) The Oral History Project was established in September 1982. A pilot project was undertaken focusing on interviews with the participants of the San Francisco Conference who were involved in drafting the Charter of the United Nations. The results of these interviews - audio tapes, transcripts and films - constitute valuable resource material for both historians and writers at large, as well as reference material for use in radio, film and other United Nations information programmes aimed at fostering greater public understanding of the work of the United Nations. By the end of 1983, interviews with six eminent personalities had been completed.

(c) Development Forum - During the biennium 20 issues of the English edition of the Development Forum were produced, 20 issues of the French edition and 15 issues of the Spanish edition. Circulation for these editions was 60,000. The business edition produced a total of 50 issues with a circulation of 4,100 copies each.

7. Activities of the Joint United Nations Information Committee (JUNIC) included the meeting of a task force on apartheid; a meeting of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Development Education; a meeting of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Audio-Visual Matters, two task force meetings on Drinking Water Supply and Sanitation Decade, five meetings of the Project Group on Development Forum, one Development Information meeting and two JUNIC sessions.
