APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUBSIDIARY ORGANS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

United Nations Administrative Tribunal

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Petr G. BELYAEV (Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic)

- 1. At its 17th meeting, on 14 October 1977, the Fifth Committee considered a note by the Secretary-General (A/32/105) concerning the vacancies which will occur in the membership of the United Nations Administrative Tribunal as a result of the expiration on 31 December 1977 of the terms of office of two of its members.
- 2. The members of the Fifth Committee had been invited to submit the names of persons who might be recommended to the General Assembly for appointment to the United Nations Administrative Tribunal, in accordance with the provisions of article 3, paragraphs 1 and 2, of the statute of the Tribunal (General Assembly resolution 351 A (IV)). Two names were submitted for the consideration of the Committee (see A/C.5/32/21).
- 3. On the proposal of the Chairman, the Fifth Committee decided without objection to dispense with the secret ballot in view of the fact that there was no contest since there were two candidates for the two vacancies.
- 4. The Fifth Committee then decided, by acclamation, to recommend Mr. Francis T. P. Plimpton (United States of America) and Sir Roger Bentham Stevens (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) to the General Assembly for appointment as members of the United Nations Administrative Tribunal for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1978.

RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

5. The Fifth Committee recommends that the General Assembly should appoint the following persons as members of the United Nations Administrative Tribunal for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1978:

Mr. Francis T. P. Plimpton, Sir Roger Bentham Stevens.
