Organization of the session

A. Opening and duration of the session

1. The Commission on Science and Technology for Development held its twelfth session at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 25 to 29 May 2009. The Commission held _____ meetings (1st to _____).
2. The session was opened by the Chairman, Mr. Juan Eduardo Eguiguren (Chile), who also made a statement.
3. Also at the 1st meeting, on 25 May, the Secretary-General of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development addressed the Commission.

4. At the same meeting, the following speakers addressed the Commission: Dr. Hamadoun Touré, Secretary-General of the International Telecommunication Union; Mr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, Chairman & CEO, Talal Abu Ghazaleh Organization, Mr. Jörg Frieden, Assistant Director-General, Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation; and Ms. Anriette Esterhuysen, Executive Director, Association for Progressive Communications

5. At the 2nd meeting, on 25 May, the Head of the CSTD Secretariat, UNCTAD, introduced the report of the Secretary-General, contained in document A/64/64-E/2009/10.

Ministerial segment

Ministerial Roundtable on the role of science, technology and innovation in stimulating economic growth and alleviating poverty

At the 1st meeting, on 25 May, the Commission held a ministerial roundtable on “The role of science, technology and innovation in stimulating economic growth and alleviating poverty”, moderated by Mr. Bertrand de la Chapelle, Special Envoy for the Information Society, French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs.

15. The Executive Coordinator of the Global Alliance for Information and Communications Technologies and Development (GAID) also made a statement.

16. Closing remarks were made by the Deputy Secretary General, ITU.
