Report of the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. The following data supplement the information contained in section III of the Secretary-General's report (A/32/230).
2. At the meeting convened by the Economic Commission for Europe at Geneva from 6 to 8 December 1977, in which the Secretary-General of the United Nations Conference on Science and Technology for Development participated, the following subject areas were selected:
 - (a) Energy: development, use and conservation of energy, notably non-conventional sources of energy for development;
 - (b) Natural resources: renewable sources and resource-saving techniques as far as non-renewable resources are concerned;
 - (c) Food: agricultural technology, including genetics and post-harvest technology, human nutrition, fishing and food-processing;
 - (d) Health: use of existing and new knowledge in planning and management-development of disease prevention and primary health services;
 - (e) Environment.
3. At the meeting convened by the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific in Bangkok from 8 to 12 December 1977, in which the Secretary-General of the Conference participated, the following subject areas were selected:
 - (a) Food and agriculture;
 - (b) Natural resources;

- (c) Energy;
- (d) Health and nutrition;
- (e) Industrialization.

4. At the meeting convened by the Economic Commission for Western Asia in Beirut from 19 to 21 December 1977, in which the Secretary-General of the Conference participated, the following subject areas were selected:

- (a) Food and agriculture;
 - (b) Transport and communications;
 - (c) Natural resources:
 - (i) Rational management and utilization;
 - (ii) Development and conservation of natural resources;
 - (iii) Renewable and non-renewable;
 - (iv) Development of non-conventional sources of energy;
 - (d) Industrialization;
 - (e) Human settlements:
 - (i) Health;
 - (ii) Social services;
 - (iii) Housing;
 - (iv) Environment.
