The text reproduced below was submitted by the representative of the United States of America and proposes amendments to the proposal to develop amendments to global technical regulation (gtr) No. 7 (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2008/115). The proposed amendments are marked in bold and in strikethrough characters.

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#### A. PROPOSAL

<u>Paragraph 4.</u>, amend to read (footnote <u>2</u>/ remains):

"4. At higher speed rear impact crashes ( $\Delta V \ge 18 \text{ km/h}$ ), there are as many minor whiplash injuries as recorded in the low speed crashes and there are a significant number of more severe whiplash injuries (MAIS 2 and MAIS 3) occurring.2/. The United States of America is currently evaluating several dummies and a dynamic test that could address these injuries."

#### B. JUSTIFICATION

These amendments are clarification to the text to better reflect the evaluations being conducted by the United States.
