Administrative and financial implications of draft resolution I
recommended by the Second Committee (A/33/399, para. 17)

Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 50th meeting, on 5 December 1978, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/33/59) on the administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution I recommended by the Second Committee (A/33/399, para. 17). In his statement, the Secretary-General indicated that the financial implications of the draft resolution would amount to \$14,700 to cover the travel and per diem expenses of one member each of the South West Africa People's Organization, the African National Congress of South Africa, the Pan-Africanist Congress of Azania, the Patriotic Front of Zimbabwe and the Palestine Liberation Organization to attend the Third General Conference of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization. The statement further indicated that no appropriation was sought at this time, since these requirements would be included in the Secretary-General's budget proposals for 1980-1981.

2. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions indicated in an oral statement that since the Conference was scheduled to be convened in 1980, the estimates would be considered by the Advisory Committee in the context of the Secretary-General's budget proposals for 1980-1981 and, therefore, the adoption of the draft resolution recommended by the Second Committee would not require additional appropriations for the present biennium.

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided by consensus to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution I recommended by the Second Committee (A/33/399, para. 17), no additional appropriation would be required for the 1978-1979 biennium.
