Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006)

Note verbale dated 28 August 2009 from the Permanent Mission of Brazil to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of Brazil to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) and has the honour to report on the measures taken by the Government of Brazil regarding the implementation of resolution 1874 (2009).

In fulfilling paragraph 22 of resolution 1874 (2009), the Permanent Mission of Brazil would like to inform the Committee that, by means of Presidential Decree 6.935 of 12 August 2009, the provisions of the aforementioned resolution were incorporated into Brazilian law and made mandatory for all Brazilian authorities. A copy of the decree is enclosed herewith.*

The Permanent Mission of Brazil would like to further inform the Committee that the General Coordination of Sensitive Goods of the Ministry of Science and Technology confirmed that, in recent years, there have been no commercial exchanges of goods that have been sanctioned in accordance with resolutions 1874 (2009) and 1718 (2006) between Brazil and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. No Brazilian suppliers were solicited by buyers from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. Moreover, no activities of technical training, assistance or advising related to the supply, manufacture, maintenance or use of such goods exist between Brazil and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, or are provided by nationals of either country to the other.
