POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT OF SOUTH AFRICA

Appointment of the members of the Ad Hoc Committee on
the Drafting of an International Convention against
Apartheid in Sports

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 2 of resolution 31/6 F of 9 November 1976, the General Assembly decided to establish an Ad Hoc Committee on the Drafting of an International Convention against Apartheid in Sports, composed of the existing members of the Special Committee against Apartheid and seven other Member States to be appointed by the President of the General Assembly on the basis of equitable geographical distribution.
2. In a communication dated 27 January 1977, the President of the General Assembly informed the Secretary-General that, following consultations with the chairmen of the regional groups, he had appointed the following seven States as members of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Drafting of an International Convention against Apartheid in Sports: Barbados, Burma, Canada, Congo, Jamaica, United Republic of Tanzania and Yugoslavia. As a result, the Ad Hoc Committee is composed of the following Member States:

Algeria, Barbados, Burma, Canada, Congo, German Democratic Republic, Ghana, Guinea, Haiti, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Jamaica, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Peru, Philippines, Somalia, Sudan, Syrian Arab Republic, Trinidad and Tobago, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, United Republic of Tanzania and Yugoslavia.
