> DEVELOPMENT AND INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION: IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECISIONS ADOPTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AT ITS SEVENTH SPECIAL SESSION

Conference on International Economic Co-operation

Report of the Secretary-General

1. The General Assembly, in paragraph 4 of resolution 3515 (XXX) of 15 December 1974, requested the Secretary-General and all other executive heads of competent organs and organizations of the United Nations system actively to assist the participants in the Conference on International Economic Co-operation. The Assembly also requested the Secretary-General to submit to it, through the Economic and Social Council, a report on his participation in the Conference. The present report, prepared in compliance with this request, should be read in conjunction with the report presented last year to the Assembly through the Economic and Social Council, covering the period up to the end of April 1976 (A/31/107 and Corr.1 and 2) and with the report of the Conference on International Economic Co-operation (A/31/478 and Add.1).

2. The opening session of the Conference on International Economic Co-operation was held in Paris, at the ministerial level, from 16 to 19 December 1975. The four commissions on energy, raw materials, development and financial affairs, established by the Conference were active in monthly sessions from February to November 1976 and during April and May 1977. From February to June 1976, the commissions devoted their activities, according to their respective mandates, to an analysis of the various problems facing the international community. From July 1976 on, they entered into a so-called "operational phase", trying to find negotiated solutions to the various issues analysed.

3. The communiqué adopted by the Conference on International Economic Co-operation on 19 December 1975 (A/31/107, annex I, para. 9) invited specific intergovernmental functional organizations directly concerned with the problems to be considered by the Conference to be represented as permanent observers in the relevant commissions. The Conference also decided that each commission might invite appropriate intergrovernmental functional organizations to participate as <u>ad hoc</u> observers in

the examination of specific questions. The United Nations Secretariat was given the status of permanent observer in all of the commissions.

5. All organs and organizations of the United Nations which were granted observer status sent delegations to each session of the commissions. The United Nations Secretariat established a small secretariat in Paris to maintain permanent contact with the Conference as well as to serve as liaison between the various organizations of the United Nations system participating in the four commissions.

6. According to their terms of reference, the observers of organizations from the United Nations system had "the right to speak but not the right to vote". During the analytical phase of the commissions' activities, the observers were invited to provide a number of documents in order to enable the participants in the Conference to understand the status of the problems within their competence. During the second phase of the commissions' activities, the contributions of the observers were more informal, consisting mainly of giving to the delegates and to the Co-Chairmen of the commissions, at their request, technical advice or views on the solutions they were contemplating for the problems before them. Annexes I and II provide a list of statements and documents circulated by the representatives of the organs and organizations of the United Nations system in the various commissions.

7. The concluding session of the Conference was held in Paris, also at the ministerial level, from 30 May to 2 June 1977. The Secretary-General addressed the Conference at the opening of the session. In addition to the United Nations Secretariat, the following organizations of the United Nations system also participated as observers: UNCTAD, FAO, GATT, UNDP, UNIDO, IMF and IBRD. The report of the Conference states that the participants welcomed the presence of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the Co-Chairmen, in their concluding statements, reiterated their appreciation to the United Nations and to the other observer organizations for their co-operation in facilitating the work of the Conference.

8. Paragraph 11 of the final report of the Conference (A/31/478) reads as follows:

"The members of the Conference agreed to transmit the results of the Conference to the General Assembly at its resumed thirty-first session and to all other relevant international bodies for their consideration and appropriate action. They further agreed to recommend that intensive consideration of outstanding problems should be continued within the United Nations system and other existing, appropriate bodies."
