VIOLATIONS OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN SOUTHERN AFRICA: REPORT OF THE
AD HOC WORKING GROUP OF EXPERTS

Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in document E/CN.4/L.1432/Rev.2: statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 28 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council additional to that contained in E/CN.4/L.1439

1. Under the terms of the draft resolution as amended in paragraph 17, the Commission on Human Rights would request the Ad Hoc Working Group of Experts, in co-operation with the Special Committee Against Apartheid, to investigate the cases of torture and murder of detainees in South Africa, contained in the report drawn up by the Special Committee Against Apartheid and communicated to the Commission, and to submit a special report on this investigation to the Commission on Human Rights at its thirty-sixth session.
