Report of the Second Committee*

1. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 18 September 2009, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-fourth session the item entitled:

“Macroeconomic policy questions:

“(a) International trade and development;

“(b) International financial system and development;

“(c) External debt and development: towards a durable solution to the debt problems of developing countries;

“(d) Commodities”

and to allocate it to the Second Committee.

2. The Second Committee held a substantive debate jointly on sub-items (b) to (d) at its 8th, 9th and 10th meetings, on 12, 13 and 14 October 2009, and on sub-item (a) at its 25th and 26th meetings, on 29 and 30 October. An account of the Committee’s discussion of the item is contained in the relevant summary records (A/C.2/64/SR.8, 9, 10, 25 and 26). Attention is also drawn to the general debate held by the Committee at its 2nd to 7th meetings, from 5 to 7 October (see A/C.2/64/SR.2-7).
