QUESTION OF THE VIOLATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND FUNDAMENTAL FREEDOMS
IN ANY PART OF THE WORLD, WITH PARTICULAR REFERENCE TO COLONIAL
AND OTHER DEPENDENT COUNTRIES AND TERRITORIES

Gabon*, Morocco, Senegal and Zaire*: draft resolution

The Commission on Human Rights,

In conformity with the principles of the Charter of the United Nations and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,

Considering, in particular, that any attempt to destroy partially or completely the national unity or territorial integrity of a country is incompatible with the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

Taking into account the Declaration on the Protection of All Persons from Being Subjected to Torture and other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment, adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations on 9 December 1975,^{1/}

Recalling that respect for human rights is inseparable from respect for international and regional conventions, and for the decisions of international organizations relating to humanitarian law,

Anxious that these instruments should be applied to the situation prevailing in the region of north-west Africa and, in particular, in the camps at Tindouf and the neighbouring area,

Decides to include in the agenda for its thirty-sixth session, as a separate item, an item entitled: "Violation of the human rights of persons in the camps at Tindouf and the neighbouring area, and all violations of the conventions relating to humanitarian law resulting from the tension which at present prevails in north-west Africa."
