### **Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) concerning Somalia**

#### **Note verbale dated 15 January 2010 from the Permanent Mission of Thailand to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of the Committee**

The Permanent Mission of Thailand to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) concerning Somalia and has the honour to submit herewith a report of the Royal Thai Government on measures taken to implement Security Council resolution 1844 (2008) (see annex).

**Report of the Kingdom of Thailand on the implementation of Security Council resolution 1844 (2008) concerning Somalia**

- The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand submits United Nations Security Council resolutions for the Cabinet's endorsement, thereby enabling the domestic authorities concerned to implement those resolutions within the framework of domestic laws.
- On 16 June 2009, the Thai Cabinet instructed the authorities concerned to implement the Security Council resolutions concerning Somalia, namely, resolutions 733 (1992), 751 (1992), 1356 (2001), 1425 (2002), 1725 (2006), 1744 (2007), 1772 (2007) and 1844 (2008). The Thai authorities concerned have since implemented the measures outlined in the said resolutions, including, but not limited to, the key operative paragraphs in resolution 1844 (2008) as follows:
  - Paragraph 1 regarding the imposition of a travel ban on individuals designated by the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992);
  - Paragraph 3 regarding the imposition of an assets freeze on individuals and entities designated by the aforesaid Committee;
  - Paragraph 7 regarding the expansion of scope of the arms embargo to include a prohibition on supplies of military equipment and training to individuals and entities designated by the aforesaid Committee.
- The main Thai authorities concerned in implementing the Security Council resolutions regarding Somalia are: the Ministry of Defence, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Transport, the Ministry of the Interior, the Ministry of Commerce, the National Intelligence Agency, the Office of the National Security Council, the Royal Thai Police, the Anti-Money Laundering Office and the Bank of Thailand.
