Administrative and financial implications of the draft
resolution contained in document E/CN.4/L.1469

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance
with rule 28 of the rules of procedure of the functional
commissions of the Economic and Social Council

1. In operative paragraph 3 of draft resolution E/CN.4/L.1469, the Commission would recommend that the Economic and Social Council should adopt a resolution which would authorize a meeting of an open-ended working group for a period of one week prior to the thirty-sixth session of the Commission on Human Rights to complete the work on a draft convention against torture.
2. On the basis of the foregoing, the relevant costs are estimated as follows:
