Admission d'observateurs: organisations présentant une demande de statut d'observateur

Note du secrétariat

1. L'admission d'organisations intergouvernementales ou non gouvernementales en qualité d'observateurs aux sessions de la Conférence des Parties est régie par le paragraphe 6 de l'article 7 de la Convention, qui dispose notamment que: «Tout organe ou organisme national ou international, gouvernemental ou non gouvernemental, compétent dans les domaines visés par la Convention, qui a fait savoir au secrétariat qu'il souhaite être représenté à une session de la Conférence des Parties en qualité d'observateur, peut y être admis en cette qualité à moins qu'un tiers au moins des Parties présentes n'y fassent objection.».
2. À sa première session, la Conférence des Parties a décidé que le secrétariat inviterait aux sessions futures de la Conférence des Parties et de ses organes subsidiaires toutes les organisations intergouvernementales ou non gouvernementales admises à cette session et aux sessions ultérieures, à moins qu'une objection concernant telle ou telle organisation ne soit formulée conformément à la Convention et au projet de règlement intérieur actuellement appliqué¹. Par conséquent, toutes les organisations admises aux sessions précédentes de la Conférence des Parties (à l'exception de celles qui avaient été admises à une seule session) ont été avisées de la tenue de la quinzième session de la Conférence des Parties, sans préjuger des décisions que celle-ci pourrait prendre à cet égard. Seules les organisations qui demandent à participer pour la première fois aux travaux de la Conférence des Parties seront soumises à la procédure d'admission.
3. Le secrétariat a dressé la liste des nouvelles organisations intergouvernementales ou non gouvernementales qui ont fait savoir qu'elles souhaitaient être admises à la quinzième session de la Conférence des Parties, pour examen par celle-ci (voir l'annexe du présent document).

4. Pour établir cette liste, le secrétariat a tenu dûment compte des dispositions du paragraphe 6 de l'article 7 de la Convention et de l'usage qui veut que les organisations qui ont le statut d'observateur prouvent qu'elles bénéficient du statut d'organisme à but non lucratif et/ou non assujetti à l'impôt, dans un État Membre de l'Organisation des Nations Unies, d'une institution spécialisée des Nations Unies ou de l'Agence internationale de l'énergie atomique, ou dans un État partie au Statut de la Cour internationale de Justice.

5. Les membres du Bureau de la Conférence des Parties ont reçu la liste des candidats et n'ont émis aucune objection concernant les organisations inscrites. Ces organisations ont été avisées que le «statut d'admission provisoire» leur avait été accordé, étant entendu qu'il appartenait à la Conférence des Parties de se prononcer en dernier ressort sur leur admission en qualité d'observateurs.

6. La Conférence est invitée, à sa première séance, à accorder le statut d'observateur aux organisations intergouvernementales ou non gouvernementales figurant sur la liste jointe en annexe.

7. Les Parties à la Convention qui sont également Parties au Protocole de Kyoto se rappelleront sans doute que le paragraphe 2 c) de la décision 36/CMP.1 disposait que, s'agissant des articles 6 et 7 du projet de règlement intérieur actuellement appliqué:

a) Les organisations admises en qualité d'observateurs aux sessions précédentes de la Conférence des Parties seraient admises à la première session de la Conférence des Parties agissant comme réunion des Parties au Protocole de Kyoto (CMP);

b) Il serait procédé en une seule fois à l'admission des organisations en qualité d'observateurs aux sessions de la Conférence des Parties et de la CMP, les décisions sur l'admission des organisations en qualité d'observateurs étant prises par la Conférence des Parties.
