Has taught courses on advanced macroeconomics, international trade, theory of economic reforms and theories of unemployment and inflation. Member of several renowned editorial boards in the Russian Federation. Member of International Advisory Boards for the Russian Economics Research Programme, the New Economic School and the European University at St. Petersburg. Also, member of the Executive Committee of the International Economic Association. Prize Laureate of the Russian Academy of Sciences in 1992 and 1999. Has authored several books on economics and mathematical methods. Holds doctorate degrees (Candidate of Science, 1971; and Doctor of Science, 1991) from the Central Economics and Mathematics Institute, Russian Academy of Sciences.
