The meeting was called to order at 11.20 a.m.

Adoption of the agenda (PBC/4/CAF/3)

1. *The agenda was adopted.*

Biannual review of the Strategic Framework for Peacebuilding in the Central African Republic (PBC/4/CAF/L.1)

2. **The Chairperson** drew attention to the draft conclusions and recommendations of the first biannual review of the Strategic Framework for Peacebuilding in the Central African Republic, which was the product of two parallel processes. One, taking place in New York, had examined developments from the standpoint of the commitments of the Peacebuilding Commission. The other, taking place in Bangui, had examined developments from the standpoint of the commitments of the national parties and civil society in the Central African Republic. The review process had concluded with a high-level forum held in Bangui on 8 December 2009.

3. He took it that the members of the Central African Republic configuration wished to adopt the draft conclusions and recommendations of the first biannual review of the Strategic Framework for Peacebuilding in the Central African Republic.

4. *It was so decided.*

Other matters

5. **Mr. Otobo** (Peacebuilding Support Office), recalling that the Central African Republic had earlier received a first allocation of \$10 million from the Peacebuilding Fund, said that the Joint Steering Committee for that country had been consulted regarding the possibility of a second allocation. Subsequently, his Office had recommended to the Secretary-General approval of a second allocation of \$20 million.
