The meeting was called to order at 3.25 p.m.

ORGANIZATION OF WORK (A/C.3/39/L.2); DRAFT SCHEDULE FOR DEADLINES FOR CLOSURE OF LIST OF SPEAKERS AND FOR SUBMISSION OF DRAFT PROPOSALS UNDER THE VARIOUS CLUSTERS OF ITEMS

1. <u>The CHAIRMAN</u> said that, if he heard no objection, he would take it that the Committee agreed to the grouping of items, the number of meetings to be allocated to each group of items and to the schedule of work.

2. It was so decided.

3. The CHAIRMAN drew attention to the informal paper containing the Bureau's proposals concerning deadlines for the closure of the list of speakers in the general debate and for the submission of draft proosals on the various clusters of items, and he assured delegations that if it was necessary to extend any deadlines those situations would be taken into account. If he heard no objection, he would take it that the Committee agreed to the proposed deadlines, namely, Friday, 12 October, at 6 p.m., and Wednesday, 17 October, at 6 p.m., respectively.

4. It was so decided.

5. <u>The CHAIRMAN</u> urged delegations or groups of delegations which had already prepared preliminary draft proposals to start their negotiations as soon as possible so that agreement could be reached and the text could be submitted quickly to the Secretariat.

The meeting rose at 3.30 p.m.
