

Addendum

- 1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of Misako Kaji (Japan) from the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, effective 1 August 2010. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of office of Ms. Kaji, which expires on 31 December 2010.
- 2. The Government of Japan has nominated Akira Sugiyama to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Ms. Kaji.
- 3. In a communication dated 26 July 2010, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Asian Group that the candidature of Mr. Sugiyama had been endorsed by the Group.

Mr. Sugiyama, as Principal Deputy Director of the Financial Affairs Division, was entrusted with the planning and implementation of the totality of the Foreign Service's budget, including Japan's assessed and voluntary contributions to the United Nations. His responsibilities also covered financial control and management, as well as procurement.

Mr. Sugiyama developed his understanding of development issues through his experience with development assistance to countries in Asia, Eurasia and Latin America, in close cooperation with the United Nations entities.

In the multilateral arena, he represented Japan in the trade rule-making negotiations of the Doha Round and headed Japan's team in several dispute cases before the World Trade Organization (WTO).
