(a) Follow-up to the International Conference on Financing for Development (*continued*) (E/2010/8-A/64/649, E/2010/64 and E/2010/83-A/65/81)

A panel discussion on the topic "South-South Cooperation and Financing for Development: Investment, Trade and Technology Transfer" followed. The panel was chaired by Mr. Morten Wetland (Norway), Vice-President, and moderated by Mr. Maged A. Abdelaziz (Egypt). The moderator made a statement and introduced the panellists: Mr. Heiner Flassbeck (Director, Division on Globalization and Development Strategies, United Nations Conference on Trade and Development); and Mr. Ajay Singh (Reddy Laboratories, India). The panellists made presentations. An interactive dialogue ensued, in which the delegations of Bangladesh, the Republic of Korea, Mongolia, Brazil and India and the Observer for the European Union participated. The panellists responded to questions raised and comments made. The moderator made concluding remarks and closed the panel discussion.
