**Report of the Royal Thai Government pursuant to paragraph 31
of the Security Council resolution 1929 (2010)**

1. On 6 July 2010, the Cabinet instructed the relevant agencies to implement Security Council resolution 1929 (2010) in accordance with the laws and regulations of Thailand, including:

The Atomic Energy for Peace Act B.E. 2504 (1961)

The Export and Import Goods Act B.E. 2522 (1979)

The Munitions of War Control Act B.E. 2530 (1987)

The Royal Decree Controlling the Exportation of Arms, Armament and War Implements B.E. 2535 (1992)

The Customs Act B.E. 2496 (1953)

The Law on Navigation in Thai Waters B.E. 2456 (1913)

The Air Navigation Act, B.E. 2497 (1954)

The Financial Institutions Business Act B.E. 2551 (2008)

The Immigration Act B.E. 2522 (1979)

2. Measures that have been taken pursuant to Security Council resolutions 1737 (2006), 1747 (2007) and 1803 (2008), including the Announcement on the Prohibition of the Export of Arms and Armaments to the Islamic Republic of Iran and the Import of Arms and Armaments from the Islamic Republic of Iran or those originated from the Islamic Republic of Iran, which was issued by the Ministry of Commerce in 2007, remain in force.

3. The Bank of Thailand and the Anti-Money Laundering Office shall coordinate with commercial bank, financial institutions and other relevant entities in implementing Security Council resolution 1929 (2010) to the extent permitted by the relevant laws and regulations of Thailand.
