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INTERNATIONAL COVENANTS ON HUMAN RIGHTS: STATUS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL RIGHTS, THE INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS AND THE OPTIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS

### Report of the Secretary-General

- 1. The General Assembly by its resolution 2200 A (XXI) of 16 December 1966 adopted and opened for signature, ratification or accession, the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, and expressed the hope that the Covenants and the Optional Protocol would be signed, ratified or acceded to without delay and would come into force at an early date. The Assembly also requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its future sessions reports concerning the status of ratifications of the Covenants and of the Optional Protocol. In response to that request, reports on the status of the International Covenants and the Optional Protocol have been submitted annually to the Assembly since its twenty-second session in 1967.
- 2. Both Covenants and the Optional Protocol were opened for signature at New York on 19 December 1966. In accordance with their respective provisions, 1/ the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights entered into force on 3 January 1976, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights entered into force on 23 March 1976, and the Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, having received the required number of ratifications or accessions, entered into force simultaneously with that Covenant on 23 March 1976.

- 3. By its resolution 38/116 of 16 December 1983, the General Assembly again invited all States that had not yet done so to become parties to both Covenants, as well as to consider acceding to the Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and invited the States parties to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights to consider making the declaration provided for in article 41 of the Covenant. The Assembly also requested the Secretary-General to submit to it at its thirty-ninth session a report on the status of the Covenants and the Optional Protocol.
- 4. As at 1 September 1984, the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights had been ratified or acceded to by 83 States, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights had been ratified or acceded to by 80 States and the Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights had been ratified or acceded to by 34 States. In addition, 9 States had signed the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, 10 States had signed the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and 7 States had signed the Optional Protocol. The list of States which have signed, ratified or acceded to the Covenants and the Optional Protocol and the dates of their signatures, ratifications or accessions appear in annexes I to III of the present report.
- 5. Upon ratification of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, or subsequently, the Governments of Austria, Canada, Denmark, Ecuador, Finland, Germany, Federal Republic of, Iceland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Peru, Senegal, Sri Lanka, Sweden and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland have made the declaration provided for in article 41 of the Covenant, recognizing the competence of the Human Rights Committee established under article 28 of the Covenant to receive and consider communications to the effect that a State party claims that another State party is not fulfilling its obligations under the Covenant. The provisions of article 41 entered into force on 28 March 1979 in accordance with paragraph 2 of that article.
- 6. As regards the implementation of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, the Sessional Working Group of Governmental Experts on the Implementation of that Covenant, established in accordance with Economic and Social Council resolution 1982/33 of 6 May 1982 and Council decision 1978/10 of 3 May 1978, held its sixth session at United Nations Headquarters from 16 April to 4 May 1984. The Group was composed of the following members elected by the Council from among the States parties to the Covenant: Bulgaria, Denmark, Ecuador, France, German Democratic Republic, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Peru, Spain, Tunisia and Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.
- 7. At its sixth session, the Group of Experts considered reports submitted by States parties under the first, second and third stages of the programme established by Economic and Social Council resolution 1988 (LX) of 11 May 1976 concerning rights covered by articles 6-9, 10-12 and 13-15 of the Covenant. The Group submitted a report to the Economic and Social Council at its first regular session of 1984 (E/1984/83), making suggestions and recommendations concerning issues arising from the consideration of reports submitted by States parties under the Covenant.

- By its resolution 1984/9 of 24 May 1984, the Economic and Social Council, inter alia, took note of the report of the Group of Experts (E/1984/83); called upon States parties to the Covenant to submit reports required under article 16 thereof, in accordance with the programme established by Council resolution 1988 (LX), and urged States parties to complete the entire cycle of initial reports before submitting second periodic reports; invited States parties to the Covenant to comply with the guidelines established by the Secretary-General concerning the form and content of reports and to take note of the relevant recommendations of the Group of Experts in preparing and submitting their reports; requested the specialized agencies, on the basis of experience gained in other bodies and of reports so far submitted and considered by the Group of Experts, to report on the progress made in achieving the observance of the provisions of the Covenant falling within the scope of their activities, in accordance with article 18 of the Covenant and paragraph 6 of Council resolution 1988 (LX); requested the Group of Experts to continue to consider including in its report to the Council brief summaries of the consideration of each country report; requested the Secretary-General to submit to the Economic and Social Council at its first regular session of 1985 a report on the composition, organization and administrative arrangements of the Group of Experts and other bodies established in accordance with existing international instruments in the field of human rights in order to facilitate the review which the Council would undertake in accordance with its resolution 1982/33; and decided that the review should be conducted at an early stage during its first regular session of 1985 to allow enough time for a full discussion of that important matter, taking into account any recommendations which the Group of Experts might agree upon at its next session.
- 9. The Economic and Social Council at its first regular session of 1984 re-elected Bulgaria and Spain as members of the Group for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 1985 and postponed to a later date the elections to fill the vacancies from the African, Asian and Latin American States.
- 10. As regards the implementation of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the Human Rights Committee held its twentieth session at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 24 October to 11 November 1983, its twenty-first session at United Nations Headquarters from 26 March to 13 April 1984 and its twenty-second session at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 9 to 27 July 1984. In accordance with article 45 of the Covenant and article 6 of the Optional Protocol, the Committee has submitted its annual report, through the Economic and Social Council, to the General Assembly at its thirty-ninth session, 2/ which covers the activities of the Committee at its twentieth, twenty-first and twenty-second sessions.

- "1. With regard to the multilateral treaties signed, ratified or acceded to by the defunct Chinese government before the establishment of the People's Republic of China, my Government will examine all their contents before making a decision in the light of the circumstances as to whether or not they should be recognized.
- "2. As from 1 October 1949, the day of the founding of the People's Republic of China, the Chiang Kai-Shek clique has no right at all to represent China. Its signature and ratification of, or accession to, any multilateral treaties by usurping the name of 'China' are all illegal and null and void. My Government will study these multilateral treaties before making a decision in the light of the circumstances as to whether or not they should be acceded to."

The lists in annexes I to III therefore do not include the signature of the two Covenants and the Optional Protocol on behalf of the "Republic of China" on 5 October 1967.
