### Follow-up to the commemoration of the two-hundredth anniversary of the abolition of the transatlantic slave trade

## Letter dated 3 November 2010 from the Permanent Representative of Jamaica to the United Nations addressed to the President of the General Assembly

I have the honour to write in my capacity as Chairman of the Committee of Interested States, drawn from all geographical regions of the world, established to oversee the decision to erect, at a place of prominence at United Nations Headquarters, a permanent memorial in acknowledgement of the tragedy and in consideration of the legacy of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade. It will be recalled that the Member States of the Caribbean Community and the African Union are playing a primary role in implementation of this initiative.

In accordance with the decision taken by the Permanent Memorial Committee, I am attaching for information an updated list of the contributions of Member States and of others to the Trust Fund for the permanent memorial to honour the victims of slavery and the transatlantic slave trade (see annex).

I should be grateful if you would circulate the present letter and its annex as a document of the General Assembly under agenda item 116.
