The situation in Côte d'Ivoire

Letter dated 7 January 2011 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2011/5)

The President: I should like to invite the representative of Côte d'Ivoire to participate in this meeting under rule 37 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure.

The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

Members of the Council have before them document S/2011/15, which contains the text of a draft resolution submitted by Bosnia and Herzegovina, France, Gabon, Germany, Lebanon, Nigeria, South Africa, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

Members of the Council also have before them document S/2011/5, containing a letter dated 7 January 2011 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council.

I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

A vote was taken by a show of hands.

In favour:

Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, China, Colombia, France, Gabon, Germany, India, Lebanon, Nigeria, Portugal, Russian Federation, South Africa, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America

The President: There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1967 (2011).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda. The Council will remain seized of the matter.
