The above meeting was not convened and hence a workplan was not developed for 2010. This meeting will now be convened on December 19<sup>th</sup> in Cairo.

As participants in the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> RCM meetings highlighted the need for this group to map the activities that the different agencies are involved in and that relate to food security, the convener conducted in March 2010a survey for this purpose. The data were analysed and a report summarizing the findings was produced. This report will be accessible via the RCM website.
