The Permanent Mission of India to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006), and has the honour to enclose herewith the national report of India on the implementation of Security Council resolution 1929 (2010) (see annex).

National report of India on the implementation of Security Council resolution 1929 (2010)

Security Council resolution 1929 (2010) concerning sanctions measures on Iran was adopted on 9 June 2010 under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations. As per paragraph 31 of the resolution, all Member States are required to report to the Security Council Committee within 60 days of the adoption of resolution 1929 (2010) on the steps they have taken with a view to implementing the resolution.

In this regard, the steps taken by the Government of India for the implementation of resolution 1929 (2010) are listed below:

- Two meetings of all concerned Government entities were convened by the Ministry of External Affairs, the nodal point for implementation of resolution 1929 (2010), on 17 June 2010 and on 29 October 2010. The Government's obligations under the above-mentioned resolution have been conveyed to all relevant authorities with an instruction to take action to fulfil them through relevant domestic laws, regulations and administrative decisions.
- Actions taken by these Government entities are as follows:
 - The Ministry of Home Affairs, in circular No. 231/2010 dated 16 November 2010, blacklisted Javad Rahiqi, date of birth: 24 April 1954, listed in annex I to resolution 1929 (2010).
 - The Ministry of Home Affairs, the Ministry of Defence, the National Authority on the Chemical Weapons Convention and the Department of Pharmaceuticals have stated that relevant provisions of resolution 1929 (2010) have been noted for implementation.
 - The Legal and Treaties Division of the Ministry of External Affairs is in the process of bringing out a Gazette of India notification on relevant aspects of resolution 1929 (2010) shortly.
 - The Directorate General of Foreign Trade is expected to shortly publish a notification regarding amendments to India's foreign trade policy to conform to resolution 1929 (2010).
