

## INFORMATION TRANSMITTED BY GOVERNMENTS CONCERNING PRISONERS OF WAR

In addition to previous replies from governments concerning prisoners of war (reproduced in documents A/AC.46/l and Add.1-7) the Secretary-General has received further replies from governments (A/AC.46/l/Add.8-30), since the Ad Hoo Commission on Prisoners of War went into recess on 15 August 1951. He has also received the following further reply from the Acting Representative of the Italian Government to the United Nations.

## YLATI

The Acting Representative of the Italian Government to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General and, following note 2229 of November 5, 1951, 1) has the honour to address, for the use of the Ad Hoc Commission for prisoners of war, the enclosed volume 2) containing the names of 14 prisoners of war, former members of the Italian Armed Forces, of whom the U.S.S.R. has acknowledged the existence in the country but who are detained for alleged collaboration.

The Acting Italian Representative takes the opportunity to enclose also a memorandum <sup>3)</sup> containing further names and useful data concerning other former members of the Italian Armed Forces whom the U.S.S.R. has failed to repatriate and to account for.
