## Guyana

[Original: English] [11 July 2011]

The views of the Government of Guyana as regards the formulation of principles that can serve as a framework for regional agreements on conventional arms control are stipulated below.

Countries must have (a) strict controls over the manufacture of firearms and the monitoring of the movements of such weapons after manufacture; and (b) transparent and strict import, export and re-export systems to facilitate proper control.

Countries should satisfy, as far as possible, the United Nations Protocol against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in Firearms, Their Parts and Components and Ammunition

Countries of the Latin American and Caribbean Region must comply with the Inter-American Convention Against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in Firearms, Ammunition, Explosives, and Other Related Materials.

Laws relating to the control of firearms in the region must be harmonized.
