Current position/function:

President of the Presidential Commission for Coordinating Executive Policy in the Field of Human Rights, involving coordination of efforts to promote and protect human rights in the country under the Commission's mandate. Term will end on 14 January 2012.

Main professional activities:

Human rights defender

The nominee received training in political science and social psychology in Guatemala as well as Mexico and Brazil, where she lived in exile. She worked in the Office of the Human Rights Advocate (*Procuraduría de los Derechos Humanos*) and for the Catholic church's inter-diocese project for the Recovery of Historical Memory (Recuperación de la Memoria Histórica – REMHI) and for community groups in Ixcán and Rabinal.

She has conducted social research on topics relating to local authorities, recovery of historical memory, human rights and social movements, among others. She has taught human rights, historical memory and conflict resolution and has been adviser to community-based organizations regarding human rights and historical memory.
