Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1970 (2011) concerning the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya

Note verbale dated 21 July 2011 from the Permanent Mission of Colombia to the United Nations addressed to the Chair of the Committee

The Permanent Mission of Colombia to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chair of the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1970 (2011) concerning the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya and refers to his note of 25 March 2011. With regard to the steps Colombia has taken for the effective implementation of paragraphs 9, 10, 15 and 17 of Security Council resolution 1970 (2011), the Permanent Mission wishes to inform him of the following:

Colombia has transmitted to its competent national authorities the two Security Council resolutions (1970 (2011) and 1973 (2011)) having to do with sanctions imposed on the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, so that they will be aware of their provisions and take any action required.

In addition, the Government has established an Inter-Agency Committee responsible for complying with the requirements of those sanctions resolutions. This Committee, a standing consultative body which exchanges information and technical advice on issues relating to the different kinds of sanctions imposed by the Security Council, comprises the:

- Ministry of the Interior and Justice;
- Ministry of Foreign Relations;
- Ministry of Defence;
- Ministry of Trade, Industry and Tourism;
- Ministry of Mines and Energy;
- Administrative Department of Security;
- Public Prosecutor's Office;
- National Taxation and Customs Authority;
- Intelligence and Financial Analysis Unit;



- Military Industry of Colombia;
- Arms Trade Control Department;
- Office of the Superintendent of Notarial and Registry Offices;
- Office of the Superintendent of Finance; and the
- Office of the Superintendent of Corporations.

To date, the Government has taken appropriate steps to implement, in accordance with its domestic legal system, the measures called for in resolution 1970 (2011). No specific instances of arms transfers or sales to the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya have thus far occurred, nor any instances of the entry or transit of individuals designated in the annexes to the Security Council resolutions in question, nor have any assets been frozen.
