NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At its 846th meeting on 5 December 1959, the General Assembly voted appropriations totalling \$US 63,149,700 for the financial year 1960 (General Assembly resolution 1443 (XIV)). At the same time, the General Assembly approved 1960 estimates for income other than staff assessment in the amount of \$5,357,500 and income from staff assessment in the amount of \$6,329,000.

The approved 1960 budget for the United Nations, with a detailed schedule of estimates within the approved appropriation sections is presented herewith.

The purposes of the 1960 budget credits initially requested were given in the original 1960 budget estimates (A/4110). Revised estimates were subsequently submitted for certain activities and the estimates were further affected by the financial implications of decisions taken by the General Assembly in the course of the fourteenth session. Also, on the basis of recommendations made by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/4170), certain reductions were made in the original estimates. The considerations upon which changes were made in the original estimates are set out in the report of the Fifth Committee (A/4336 and Corr.1), which records the basis on which the General Assembly took action on the level of the 1960 appropriations. The adjustments which were made in the original estimates for 1960, during the course of the fourteenth session of the General Assembly, are summarized in the notes to the various budget sections.

For similar items, the relevant amounts approved by the General Assembly for 1959 (A/4327) are also given.
