**NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL**

1. The financial statements of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East for the fiscal year ended 31 December 1959, together with the report of the Board of Auditors thereon, are presented herewith pursuant to the provisions of resolution 302 (IV) adopted by the General Assembly on 8 December 1949. In paragraph 21 of that resolution, the General Assembly:

*"Requests the Director to submit to the General Assembly of the United Nations an annual report on the work of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East, including an audit of funds . . ."*

2. The financial statements and the report of the Board of Auditors have been submitted to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions for consideration and report to the General Assembly.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

***For the year ended 31 December 1959***

### STATEMENT OF BUDGET AND EXPENDITURE

**Note 1.** The budget figures for 1959 shown in statement I reflect the Agency's budget as prepared under the provisions of General Assembly resolution 1315 (XIII). The budget figures for 1958 represent unexpended allotments against that year's budget carried forward for expenditure in 1959.

**Note 2.** The budget and expenditure figures appearing in the financial statements and supporting schedules are based upon the Agency's gross requirements on an accrual basis, modified to the extent that buildings and structures and equipment in use have been charged to expenditure in the period of construction or issue for use (see Note 11). Consequently losses of such assets (amounting to \$983 for the current year) have also been excluded from the expenditure figures.

### STATEMENT OF INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

**Note 3.** Income as reflected in statement II represents only income to UNRWA and excludes contributions made direct to the refugees by voluntary agencies and others. To be classified as "income to UNRWA" a contribution must be subject to direct and complete control by the Agency, and must, in addition, be of a type which the Agency can use in its programme.

**Note 4.** Contributions of cash to the Agency from countries where exchange restrictions are in force are stated in United States dollars at official rates of exchange prevailing at the time of receipt. Other cash contributions are stated in United States dollars at rates which approximate the average free market rates for such currencies.

**Note 5.** Contributions in kind to the Agency are stated at values indicated by the contributors, if known; otherwise at values considered by the Agency as appropriate.

**Note 6.** Exchange adjustments result from recording transactions in currencies other than United States dollars at fixed rates of exchange. These fixed rates approximate average market rates in free currencies and official rates in controlled currencies.

**Note 7.** Income from investments of assets designated for the Agency's Provident Fund scheme, and expenses associated with the administration of the Provident Fund scheme, are not included in statements I and II but have been credited and debited, respectively, to the Reserve for Staff Separation Costs in accordance with the Provident Fund Regulations.

### STATEMENT OF ASSETS, LIABILITIES AND WORKING CAPITAL

**Note 8.** Assets and liabilities in currencies other than United States dollars are shown in United States dollars at the fixed rates employed by the Agency throughout the year. These rates are the official exchange rates except in the case of Lebanese pounds, Syrian pounds, Canadian dollars and Swiss francs where the rates approximate the free market rates for the period under review.

**Note 10.** Inventories of usable supplies and equipment are valued at cost or at the Agency's standard prices which approximate cost. Inventories of surplus and salvage supplies and equipment are valued at half standard prices.

**Note 11.** The following assets of the Agency are not reflected as such in the statement of assets and liabilities:

(a) Loans to refugees totalling \$111,347, most of which is believed to be uncollectable;

(b) Capital stock of The Development Bank of Jordan Limited, at a cost of \$1,470,000;

(c) Equipment and vehicles in use, which cost \$3,081,989;

(d) Structures and buildings (principally refugee shelters, classrooms and distribution centres), which cost \$8,650,026 to construct.

Disbursements for these assets have been treated as expenditure in the current financial statements or in the statements for prior periods (see also note 2).

**Note 12.** The Agency had, at 31 December 1959, contingent liabilities of \$3,267,221 mainly comprising purchase orders issued for goods and services not yet received. There was also \$917,216 outstanding on procurement requests sent to UNICEF (as the Agency's procurement agent) but on which purchase orders had not yet been placed.

# REPORT OF THE BOARD OF AUDITORS ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE UNITED NATIONS RELIEF AND WORKS AGENCY FOR PALESTINE REFUGEES IN THE NEAR EAST FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1959

1. The Director of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East submitted to the Board of Auditors the following financial statements for audit certificates:

Statement I. Budget and expenditure for the year ended 31 December 1959;

Statement II. Income and expenditure for the year ended 31 December 1959;

Statement III. Working capital for the year ended 31 December 1959;

Statement IV. Assets, liabilities and working capital as of 31 December 1959.

2. Examinations of transactions, accounts and inventories were conducted to the extent deemed necessary. All information required was provided and the Board wishes to record its appreciation of the co-operation and assistance extended by the Director and officers of the Agency.

3. The approved budget for 1959 totalled \$37,475,000. In addition, the Agency has carried over unused funds from the 1958 budget, totalling \$1,420,004. The budget has thus been increased to \$38,895,004. According to the revised Financial Regulations, effective 1 January 1959, the Director "may authorize the carry forward into the following financial year of any unexpended budget provision made for any purpose other than recurrent operating costs". (See paragraph 3 of last year's report.<sup>1</sup>)

4. According to statement II, the expenditure in 1959 was \$34,138,380 and the income \$33,958,878. The Working Capital has been reduced by the balance, \$179,502 (statement III).

5. According to statement I, there is overspending of the budgetary provisions under some headings offset by underspending under other headings. Taking into consideration the amounts carried forward to the 1960 budget, the overspending is \$1,461,117 against an operational reserve of \$800,000, and savings under other headings. The overspending is mainly due to unforeseen circumstances.

6. *The Development Bank of Jordan Limited.* The Agency has paid an additional amount of \$350,000 to the Bank, total payment thus being \$1,470,369. For the additional payment the Agency received 50,000 class "C" shares of JD 1 each in connexion with the general expansion of the Bank and 75,000 class "C" shares at JD 1 each subject to the understanding that an equal amount of the Bank's capital will, upon receipt of payment of the subscription, be allocated to loans under the new joint Grants/Loans Scheme in Jordan.

The Agency is now owner of 525,000 class "C" shares in the Bank. During the year ended 31 March 1959, the Bank made a net profit of \$48,059. (See paragraph 7 of last year's report.)

7. The payment of a cost of living bonus to all locally recruited staff, mentioned in paragraph 8 of last year's report, was continued in 1959. A survey to review the Agency's staffing pattern and salary scales has been carried out in 1959 under the direction of one of the professors of the American University of Beirut. The report on the survey is now under consideration by the Agency.

8. *Ex gratia payments.* According to schedule N, *ex gratia* payments totalling \$8,990 have been made during 1959. The payments can be grouped as follows:

In respect of "payments made to separated staff members \$3,223" an amount of \$521 has been refunded to the Agency in 1960.

9. The total losses for 1959 are \$138,107, (schedules A to P) comprised of the following:

A substantial part of the recorded loss is due to setting up a reserve for expected loss on disposal of surplus and salvage inventories.

Not included in the amount of \$113,012 for supplies are the normal losses in connexion with ration distribution and the normal losses on basic commodities in connexion with transportation and warehousing according to the percentages approved by the Agency.

The Board has noted that the Agency has taken steps to strengthen the inventory control of supplies and equipment.

10. The balance of unpaid pledges prior to 1959 was \$307,788, cf. schedule Q. Of this amount, two pledges totalling \$30,000 have been outstanding since 1953.

11. Statement II shows exchange adjustments of \$564,139. This amount is mainly the result of book

revaluation of some currencies and is therefore not a real gain on exchange.

12. *The Provident Fund.* It has now been decided that the Provident Fund will remain within the UNRWA funds and accounts and will not be shown as a separate entity. The Fund shall be administered and controlled by and at the discretion of the Director, and in accordance with such instructions and procedures as he may prescribe. As at 31 December 1959 the capital of the fund was \$3,032,761.

13. *Staff.* At the year-end, the number of international staff was 128 as against 149 approved posts. The number of area staff was 10,177, as against 10,519 approved posts.
