## Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members and alternate members of the United Nations Staff Pension Committee

## **Report of the Fifth Committee**

1. At its 35th plenary meeting, on 17 October 2011, the General Assembly, on the proposal of the Secretary-General (A/66/231), decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-sixth session, under the item entitled "Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments", a sub-item entitled "Appointment of members and alternate members of the United Nations Staff Pension Committee" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.

2. At its 16th meeting, on 4 November 2011, the Fifth Committee considered a note by the Secretary-General (A/66/531) concerning a vacancy in the membership of the United Nations Staff Pension Committee as a result of the resignation of Andrei Vitalievitch Kovalenko (Russian Federation). By that note, the Fifth Committee was informed of the nomination by the Government of the Russian Federation and the endorsement by the Group of Eastern European States of Dmitry S. Chumakov (Russian Federation) to fill the remainder of the term of office of Mr. Kovalenko, which expires on 31 December 2012.

3. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, by acclamation, to recommend to the General Assembly that it appoint Mr. Chumakov as a member of the United Nations Staff Pension Committee for a term of office beginning on \_\_\_\_\_ 2011<sup>1</sup> and ending on 31 December 2012 (see para. 4).

## **Recommendation of the Fifth Committee**

4. The Fifth Committee recommends that the General Assembly appoint Dmitry S. Chumakov (Russian Federation) as a member of the United Nations Staff Pension
