Letter dated 27 December 2011 from the Permanent Representative of the Syrian Arab Republic to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

Upon instruction from my Government, I have the honour to transmit herewith a document prepared by the Syrian authorities which includes statistics of the crimes of killing, kidnapping, robbery and theft of cars that happened in the Syrian Arab Republic during the period between 15 March 2011 and 19 December 2011. The statistics are documented with the date and time of all the incidents along with other information (see annex).

I would highly appreciate if the present letter and its annex were to be circulated as a document of the Security Council, noting that all the supporting documents related to the attached statistics are available, if needed, with the Government of the Syrian Arab Republic.

Statistics on the murders, abductions, looting and theft of cars that have taken place in the Syrian Arab Republic since current events began to 19 December 2011

A. Murders of civilians, soldiers and police reported by hospitals and police units, 3,259, distributed as follows:

It should be noted that the exact number of civilians killed during the events is not known, because it has not been possible to gain access to their corpses. Nor has it been possible to keep proper records, because victims were often buried immediately by relatives, who did not report their deaths. Others were buried by the armed groups in order to prevent their identity being known.

2. Deaths of military personnel: there were 913 martyrs from the army, in accordance with the Ministry of Defence lists sent to the National Security Office to 18 December 2011.

3. Deaths of police personnel: 215 police have been martyred.
