REPORT AND ACCOUNTS, INCLUDING THE REPORT OF THE BOARD OF AUDITORS THEREON, FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 1962, PRESENTED BY THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON BEHALF OF THE UNITED NATIONS JOINT STAFF PENSION BOARD TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS AND TO MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS OF THE FUND; REPORT ON ACTION TAKEN BY THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD SINCE THE LATTER'S ELEVENTH SESSION (APRIL-MAY 1962)

I. Introduction

1. The present report is submitted to the General Assembly of the United Nations and to member organizations pursuant to article XXXV of the Regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund.

2. In the absence of a session of the Joint Staff Pension Board in 1963, the report is presented on behalf of the Board by its Standing Committee. 3. As provided in article XXXV of the Regulations, the report contains a balance-sheet and other information on the operation of the Regulations during the year ended 30 September 1962. It also includes a summary of action taken by the Standing Committee on behalf of the Board since the latter's eleventh session (April-May 1962).

II. Member organizations

4. The following eleven organizations are members of the Fund: United Nations; International Labour Organisation; Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations; United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization; World Health Organization; International Civil Aviation Organization; World Meteorological Organization; Interim Commission for the International Trade Organization; International Atomic Energy Agency; Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultative Organization; International Telecommunication Union.

III. Operation of the Fund during the year ended 30 September 1962

5. During the year ended 30 September 1962, the number of participants in the Fund increased from 11,765 to 12,501 and the number of associate participants from 4,611 to 5,929. A break-down of the figures by member organization and by medical classification will be found in tables 1-6 of annex III.

6. During the year, the principal of the Fund increased from \$121,748,420 to \$142,540,915. Details of the Fund's accounts will be found in statements 1 and 2 and schedules 1, 2 and 3 of annex I. The report of the Board of Auditors is to be found in annex II.

7. The effective yield on the investment of the Fund's assets, after the deduction of investment costs, was at the annual rate of 3.94 per cent, this being .69 per cent above the statutory rate and .06 per cent higher than the previous year. Of this earned yield, .69 per cent has

been credited to the contingency reserve and 3.25 per cent has been taken into income for the period in question. A summary of investments as of 30 September 1962 and a comparison of their book and market values are to be found in schedules 4 and 5 of annex I. Details concerning the contingency reserve are given in schedule 2 of annex I.

8. As of 30 September 1962, the Fund was paying 502 retirement pensions, 58 annuities, 203 widows' pensions, 307 children's benefits, 48 disability benefits, and 6 secondary dependant's benefits. In the course of the year, it paid 731 cash withdrawal settlements, 472 of which were to participants with less than five years' service, and 259 to participants with five years' service or more. Further details concerning benefits are to be found in tables 7-10 of annex III.

IV. Action taken by the Standing Committee on behalf of the Board since the latter's eleventh session (April-May 1962)

9. At its eleventh session, the Board elected the following as members of its Standing Committee, to serve until the twelfth session of the Board:

10. The following officers were elected by the Standing Committee:

Chairman: Dr. R. Coigney (WHO);

Vice-Chairman: Mr. L. Michelmore (UN).

11. Mr. H. R. Wilmot served as Secretary of the Board until 15 April 1963 and in that capacity attended the meetings of the Committee. Mr. B. W. Pringle thereafter acted as Secretary until the arrival of Mr. A. C. Liveran on 28 May 1963. Dr. Szeming Sze, Medical Consultant of the Board, also attended certain meetings of the Committee.

12. Under the terms of article XXII of the Regulations of the Fund, the Standing Committee acts on behalf of the Board when the latter is not in session. In the course of six meetings held between May 1962 and June 1963, it took the following action:

(a) The report of the Board of Auditors on the financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 September 1961 was received and noted.¹ This was included in the annual report of the United Nations Joint Staff Pensions Board to the seventeenth session of the General Assembly.²

(b) The appointments of Mr. A. C. Liveran and Mr. B. W. Pringle as Secretary and Deputy-Secretary

respectively of the Board were recommended to the Secretary-General of the United Nations (the appointments have been made; Mr. Pringle took up his duties on 15 March 1963 and Mr. Liveran on 28 May 1963);

(c) A reply to questions put by the United Nations Administrative Tribunal in a case involving participation in the Fund was approved;¹

(d) Estimates of the administrative expenses of the Fund for the year 1964 were approved. The Committee authorized, subject to the approval of the General Assembly, expenditures from the Fund up to an amount of 250,100;¹

(e) The financial statements for the year ended 30 September 1962 were approved;

(f) The Audit Certificate and the report of the Board of Auditors on the financial statements for the year ended 30 September 1962 were noted: the point raised in paragraph 4 of the report, relating to the difference in exchange value of the United States and Canadian currencies, will be considered at the next meeting of the Pension Board in 1964;

(h) The reports of the Investments Committee were received and noted; the Standing Committee considered the desirability of undertaking certain special studies in this connexion;¹

(*i*) The annual report of the Board, presented by the Standing Committee on its behalf to the General Assembly of the United Nations and to member organizations was adopted.

¹ The Board, at its eleventh session, specifically delegated its authority to the Standing Committee in connexion with this item.

Schedule 5

Report of the Board of Auditors on the accounts of the Fund for the year ended 30 September 1962

1. In accordance with article XXXIX of the Regulations of the Fund, the Board of Auditors carried out an audit of the accounts of the Fund for the year ended 30 September 1962.

2. The Secretary of the Joint Staff Pension Fund submitted the following statements:

I. Statement of assets and liabilities as at 30 September 1962,

II. Statement of income and expenditure for the year ended 30 September 1962.

In accordance with the usual practice the statements have been certified by the Board of Auditors.

3. As in previous years, the Board's examination has been carried out to the extent considered necessary to certify the statements.

4. A footnote to statement I pointed out that, as in previous years, the Fund's assets in Canadian dollars are expressed in

that currency, as are benefits payable in this currency. The Board noted that for the valuation of these assets and liabilities the Canadian dollars have been taken at par with United States dollars. As there exists, however, a marked depreciation of the Canadian dollar in respect of the US dollar (TAB rate in effect on 1 January 1963 being Canadian \$1.08 to US\$1.00) the Board holds the view that the valuation should have been made at the existing rate of exchange.

5. The Board wishes to record its appreciation for the cooperation and assistance rendered it by the Secretary of the Pension Board and staff, and by the United Nations Secretariat.
