Subject: **Designation of duty stations for purposes of rest and recuperation**

1. In accordance with administrative instruction ST/AI/2011/7, on rest and recuperation, and following inter-agency consultations, the Office of Human Resources Management approves the duty stations that qualify for rest and recuperation, determines the duration of the period of qualifying service (frequency) and designates rest and recuperation destinations. Annex I to the present circular lists the duty stations approved for rest and recuperation purposes effective 1 January 2012.

2. Should security or severe hardship conditions improve or deteriorate at specific duty stations during the course of the year, the frequency may be adjusted by the Office of Human Resources Management following inter-agency consultations. Similarly, significant changes in a duty station environment may result in the approval or discontinuation of rest and recuperation.

3. Although the Organization designates rest and recuperation destinations, eligible individuals may travel to any location. However, the Organization's financial responsibility is limited to the cost of travel at the lowest fare, economy class, by the cheapest and most direct route from the duty station approved for rest and recuperation purposes to the designated rest and recuperation destination. Whenever United Nations transportation is available, it will be provided free of charge and no payment of travel costs will apply. In the absence of United Nations transportation, the Organization may purchase the ticket or provide a lump sum payment.
