Revitalization of the work of the General Assembly

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Report of the Secretary-General

1. By its resolution 65/315, the General Assembly decided to establish, at its sixty-sixth session, an ad hoc working group on the revitalization of the work of the General Assembly, open to all Member States:

(a) To identify further ways to enhance the role, authority, effectiveness and efficiency of the Assembly, inter alia, by building on previous resolutions and evaluating the status of their implementation;

(b) To submit a report thereon to the Assembly at its sixty-sixth session.

2. In the same resolution, the General Assembly also decided that the Ad Hoc Working Group should continue its review of the inventory of General Assembly resolutions on revitalization, based on the updated annex to the report of the Ad Hoc Working Group submitted at the sixty-third session (A/63/959), and requested the Secretary-General to submit an update on the provisions of the Assembly resolutions on revitalization addressed to the Secretariat for implementation that had not yet been implemented, with an indication of the constraints and reasons behind any lack of implementation, for further consideration by the Ad Hoc Working Group at the sixty-sixth session.

3. The present update report is submitted pursuant to that resolution.

No assistant to the Spokesperson for the President of the General Assembly has been provided since January 2008	Department of Public Information has organized periodic press conferences by the President of the General Assembly, both to enhance contact with the media and to increase the visibility of the Assembly and its work. Further, the Department for General Assembly and Conference Management has facilitated the organization of interactive hearings with representatives of civil society before major conferences, summits and other high-level meetings, as mandated, for the same purposes. The Department for General Assembly and Conference Management has also organized informal plenary meetings of the General Assembly to hear periodic briefings by the President of the General Assembly and the Secretary-General. The Department for General Assembly and Conference Management regularly briefs the media on the General Assembly's elections and programme of work. In addition, the Secretary-General has been reporting to the Assembly, through the Committee on
