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### NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

- 1. At its 2031st plenary meeting, on 22 December 1971, the General Assembly adopted resolution 2899 (XXVI) in which it established the level of the United Nations budget appropriations for the financial year 1972 at \$213,124,410 and approved an estimate of income other than income from staff assessment in the amount of \$10,608,000. Estimated income from staff assessment was approved in the amount of \$25,313,650.
- 2. The nature and purposes of the budget are set forth in two basic documents, the initial budget estimates submitted by the Secretary-General for the financial year 1972 1/ and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions. 2/ Subsequently, the Secretary-General submitted a series of revised estimates affecting the initial estimates, including those resulting from decisions taken by the Economic and Social Council at its fiftieth and fifty-first sessions, as well as from decisions taken by the General Assembly in the course of its twenty-sixth session. In each case, these estimates were the subject of a recommendation by the Advisory Committee. The discussion of the total budget estimates in the Fifth Committee and its recommendations thereon are reflected in its report to the General Assembly. 3/
- 3. There follows a schedule indicating in detail the appropriations under each budget section, subject, however, to the global reduction of \$1,250,000 imposed by the General Assembly in its resolution 2836 (XXVI) of 17 December 1971 in respect of the provisions made under the appropriate sections of the budget for United Nations documentation. The distribution of this reduction will be reflected in the allotment advices to be issued by the Office of the Controller.
