- B. REPORT OF THE BOARD OF AUDITORS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE ACCOUNTS AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE VOLUNTARY FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY THE UNITED NATIONS HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED

 31 DECEMBER 1970
- 1. The Board of Auditors, established under General Assembly resolution 74 (I), is required to audit the accounts of the United Nations, including all trust and special accounts, in accordance with United Nations Financial Regulations 12.1-12.5 and the annex to these regulations, as well as in accordance with paragraph 22 of the Statute of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and article XII of the Financial Rules for Voluntary Funds (A/AC.96/316) promulgated by the High Commissioner.
- 2. The United Nations High Commissioner submitted the following financial statements for audit together with other supporting detailed analysis and schedules:

Statement I.	Balance-sheet as at 31 December 1970.
Statement II.	Income and expenditure in 1970.
Schedule 1.	Loan operations.
Schedule 2.	Obligations incurred, liquidated and outstanding as at 31 December 1970.
Schedule 3.	Governmental contributions paid or pledged in 1970.
Schedule 4.	Private donations received in 1970.
Schedule 5.	UNHCR Programme for 1970 - allocations and expenditure by area and object.
Schedule 6.	Emergency Fund - allocations and expenditure in 1970 by object.
Schedule 7.	Special trust funds - funds available and expenditure during 1970 by area and purpose.
Schedule 8.	Long-playing Records Account - allocations and expenditure.
Schedule 9.	Income and expenditure of the indemnification funds in 1970 and cumulative.

A ...

Scope of the audit

- 3. The responsibilities of the Board of Auditors are governed by the principles set out in the annex to the United Nations Financial Regulations, referred to in article XII, regulation 12.1, thereof, which reads as follows:
 - "1. The Board of Auditors shall perform an audit of the accounts of the United Nations, including all trust and special accounts, as it may deem necessary in order to certify:
 - (a) That the financial statements are in accord with the books and records of the Organization;
 - (b) That the financial transactions reflected in the statements have been in accordance with the Rules and Regulations, the budgetary provisions, and other applicable directives;
 - (c) That the securities and moneys on deposit and on hand have been verified by certificate received direct from the Organization's depositories or by actual count."
- 4. The examination of the accounts and financial statements has included a review of the accounting procedures and system of internal control, test of the transactions and accuracy of the accounting records and other supporting evidence, information and explanations to the extent considered necessary in the circumstances.
- 5. Following its examination, the Board of Anditors transmitted a long-form report containing its findings and recommendations to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. In submitting this long-form report to the Secretary-General and the High Commissioner, the Board of Auditors proposed, and they agreed, that distribution of this report should be solely at their direction and copies are accordingly made available by the Secretary of the Board only upon receipt of that direction.
- 6. The Board of Auditors, in consultation with the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, decided in 1970 to discontinue the carrying out of its examination of the management and administration of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. As a result of this decision, the Board did not continue its examination, which was undertaken in these areas in 1968 and 1969. However, it is understood that the United Nations Administrative Management Service will take into consideration the Board's comments and recommendations contained in its report when the manpower survey is conducted later this year.

Special reserves

7. With regard to operations of the Funds Set Aside (\$1,500,000) and the Emergency Fund (\$500,000), the Board is of the opinion that more positive clarification is needed between General Assembly resolution 1166 (XII) establishing the Emergency Fund and the action taken by the Executive Committee of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees establishing the Funds Set Aside and defining its purposes. The Board therefore recommends that appropriate

revisions be made to these authorizations with a view to clarifying the authorizations, sources, purposes and utilization of these reserves and their interrelationship.

Loan situation in Greece

8. The history of the loan situation in Greece and its related problems was set out in the Board of Auditors report on the 1968 financial statements. 1/
The following table shows the changes that have taken place with respect to the mortgage agreements since that time:

- 9. The Internal Audit Service continued its audit programme during the year including a review of loan repayments. They reported that they were able to reasonably satisfy themselves that repayments received from individual refugees were distributed in accordance with the terms of the project agreements and that the periodic repayments being made by the Governments were correct.
- 10. Last year the Board reported that 50 per cent of the repayments due at 31 December 1969 were in arrears and it has not been able to ascertain the arrears situation as at 31 December 1970 as the required reports have not been received by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. The Board understands that the difficulties involved in obtaining these reports are under discussion with the appropriate authorities concerned. In the absence of such reports, it is extremely difficult for the Office to effectively monitor these activities.

Administrative expenses

11. The administrative costs of the Office of the High Commissioner for 1970, amounting to \$4,269,341, were provided for under the regular budget of the United Nations (section 18), in accordance with paragraph 20 of the statute of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. The administrative costs have been partially offset since 1965 by a grant-in-aid made from voluntary funds. This grant-in-aid, which had its inception in 1965, on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, is in the amount of 10 per cent of the High Commissioner's programme commitments for the prior year. It amounted to \$536,208 in 1970.


C. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS


- 1. Firm pledges for 1971 received from Governments in a total of \$2,343,519 are not recorded in the accounts at 31 December 1970.
- 2. Igreements were signed or Letters of Instruction were issued prior to 31 December 1970 committing 1971 funds in an amount of \$1,663,884. These commitments are not recorded in the accounts.
- 3. Obligations for projects include \$200,000 obligated on the basis of a Letter of Instruction to the UNHCR Representative in India for the local settlement project in Mainpat. This project is now to be implemented by the Government of India and an appropriate agreement is in the process of finalization. However, it is unlikely that the actual implementation could start before autumn 1971.
- 4. At its twenty-first session, the Executive Committee was informed by the High Commissioner (A/AC.96/437, para. 6) that the total allocations from the Emergency Fund in 1970 might well exceed its total income, leaving a gap which at that time was anticipated at \$40,000. The High Commissioner proposed to cover any such gap from the repayments of loans accumulated in the Funds Set Aside, which totalled \$1,043,774. This proposal was duly noted by the Executive Committee. Following a major emergency in the Sudan, for which an allocation of \$150,000 had to be made late in 1970, the actual gap amounted to \$163,547. This amount was therefore transferred from the Funds Set Aside to bring the Emergency Fund to its ceiling of \$500,000, and the Funds Set Aside in turn were replenished from adjustments on prior years' projects.
- 5. The <u>ex-gratia</u> payment of \$932 represents expenditure incurred in consequence of the tragic event of 19 November 1970 in Addis Ababa in which a staff member of UNHCR, Miss Marie-Louise Bertschinger, lost her life in the line of duty.








