SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/20370 of 11 January 1989, S/20370/Add.16 of 2 May 1989, S/20370/Add.23 of 21 June 1989, S/20370/Add.29 of 3 August 1989 and S/20370/Add.30 of 10 August 1989.

During the week ending 12 August 1989, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Letter dated 25 April 1989 from the Permanent Representative of Panama to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council (see S/20370/Add.16).

In a letter dated 7 August 1989 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/20773), the Permanent Representative of Panama to the United Nations recalled that, at its 2861st meeting, on 28 April 1989, the Security Council had decided that the time of its next meeting to continue consideration of the item would be fixed at a later date. He requested that, in view of the fact that the United States troops in Panamanian territory had continued the dangerous escalation of their acts of intimidation, provocation and aggression against Panama, in violation of its sovereignty and territorial integrity and of the Panama Canal Treaties, a meeting of the Security Council be convened as soon as possible to renew consideration of the item, which had been the subject of his letter of 25 April 1989 (S/20606).

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2874th meeting, held on 11 August 1989, on the basis of the above request.
