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I. FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1968

- 1. I have the honour to submit herewith my financial report for the year ended 31 December 1968 together with the audited accounts of the United Nations Development Programme for the year ended 31 December 1968 and the report of the Board of Auditors. The accounts are comprised of five statements (I through V) certified by the United Nations Board of Auditors and are supported by eight schedules.
- 2. This submission is made in conformity with the decision of the General Assembly ("other decisions" relative to resolution 2196 (XXI) to accept the recommendation of the Fifth Committee, 1/ and with articles 24.6 and 25.2 of the United Nations Development Programme (Special Fund) Financial Regulations).
- 3. Separate reports on the consolidated financial position of the United Nations Development Programme (Special Fund) and the United Nations Development Programme (Technical Assistance) will be submitted to the Governing Council and to the General Assembly in accordance with General Assembly resolution 519 A (VI), article 30.3 of the United Nations Development Programme (Technical Assistance) Finance Manual and article 25.3 of the United Nations Development Programme (Special Fund) Financial Regulations.

United Nations Development Programme (Technical Assistance) Account

- 4. The financial operations of the Technical Assistance Account are presented in statement I, supported by schedules 1 and 2.
- 5. Statement I provides data on resources and the use of such resources. It shows that total resources available were \$79,825,387 consisting primarily of net contributions pledged (\$64,199,714), local costs income (\$4,110,432), surrenders by participating and executing agencies (\$1,016,588), and a balance (\$7,356,726) which was unencumbered at 31 December 1967.
- 6. During 1968, all but \$4,615,294 was allocated. Programme allocations were \$63,556,007; allocations towards the administrative budget of the UNDP secretariat were \$6,170,364; and \$2,924,633, issued by the UNDP Revolving Fund in 1967 to participating and executing agencies to carry out contingency activities, was restored to that fund.
- 7. Schedule 1 indicates that at 1 January 1968 there were unpaid prior years' pledges by Governments totalling \$12,270,495. In 1968, new pledges were \$64,570,314, a modest increase of \$4,214,634 over 1967. Collections during 1968 were \$58,358,935 representing 76 per cent of the total amount collectable (\$76,840,209) and \$8,153,047 less than was collected during 1967 (\$66,511,982). The balance of pledges outstanding at 31 December 1968 (\$18,481,874) represents an increase of \$5,982,951 over the comparable figure (\$12,498,923) at 31 December 1967.

United Nations Development Programme (Special Fund) Account

- 8. The financial operations of the Special Fund Account are presented in statement II, supported by schedules 3 through 7.
- 9. Statement II presents a summary of income received and allocations made. Total resources available were \$291,072,195 of which \$119,038,032 represented unallocated resources at 31 December 1967; \$149,799,941 net adjusted income from pledges, including \$37,000,000 pledged by the Government of Sweden for 1970 and 1971; \$10,743,689 contributions by recipient Governments towards local costs; \$3,595,138 cash counterpart contributions of recipient Governments; and \$7,895,512 interest earned on investments.
- 10. Against these resources, allocations and earmarkings were issued, or provided for, in the amount of \$156,441,665 including \$161,092,328 in respect of approved projects, \$10,969,536 towards the administrative budget of the UNDP secretariat and a decrease of \$16,798,472 to the reserve for projects awaiting authorization to commence operations.
- ll. This reserve is made in respect of projects for which, at the end of the year, plans of operation had been signed, but the full amount of the allocations had not been issued. At 31 December 1967, the allocations not issued pending authorization to commence operations amounted to \$32,582,725, of which \$30,613,378 was issued during 1968. At 31 December 1968, a reserve of \$13,814,906 was made for allocations not yet issued in respect of projects for which plans of operation had been signed during 1968.
- 12. The unallocated resources remaining at 31 December 1968 were therefore \$134,630,530, which represents the net assets of the Special Fund Account and is comprised of cash (\$29,784,885) which includes \$3,936,936 held in resident representatives' bank accounts; government notes and letters of credit (\$68,997,685); investments and loans (\$131,772,927); Governments' pledges receivable (\$202,833,750); and sundry accounts receivable (\$48,166,318) totalling \$481,555,565, less undrawn allocations (\$342,129,554) and sundry amounts payable (\$4,795,481) totalling \$346,925,035.
- 13. Investments and loans are detailed in schedule 6 and attention is invited to the summary which groups the portfolio into six broad categories.
- 14. Schedule 3 lists the status of contributions pledged by country, and reflects the fact that pledges outstanding at 31 December 1968 were \$202,833,750. This amount includes the sun of \$162,564,069 due for the financial years 1969 through 1971. The balance due for 1968 and prior years is therefore \$40,269,681 which represents an increase of \$13,660,592 over the comparable figure (\$26,609,089) at 31 December 1967.
- 15. Of the balance of \$21,116,423 due in respect of recipient Governments' local costs contributions shown in schedule 4, \$3,608,690 was due in respect of 1968 and prior years and \$17,507,733 is in respect of future years' obligations.
- 16. As indicated in schedule 5, \$10,517,476 was due from recipient Governments in respect of cash counterpart contributions of which \$3,766,981 was due in respect of 1968 and prior years and \$6,750,495 was due in respect of future years' obligations.

- 17. At its ninth session, the Governing Council of the Special Fund adopted the report (SF/L.72) of an informal working group on financial policy, 2/ and defined the technical terms of that report. The Governing Council defined earmarkings to include, inter alia, "a reserve for the contingency authority given by the Governing Council for use by the Managing Director amounting to 10 per cent of the total earmarkings for each programme but subject to the limitation that the total earmarking approved by the Governing Council for any particular project will not be increased by more than 25 per cent". 3/ The Governing Council also defined allocations and, inter alia, commented that "allocations of funds are made by the Managing Director under the authority of earmarkings made by the Governing Council". 4/ Subsequently, the Governing Council decided that increased project costs arising from decisions relating to increases in the level of reimbursement of executing agency overhead costs and to increases in the international salary scales should be covered from the contingency reserve without prejudice to the 25 per cent limitation for individual projects. 5/
- 18. The Governing Council of the Special Fund (now the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme) thus delegated to me the authority to issue allocation—up to 25 per cent in excess of the Council earmarking for any particular project, with the exceptions specified above, exclusive of allocations for Government cash counterpart contributions which are not included in the Governing Council project earmarkings. The excess of allocations over the Governing Council project earmarkings were to be financed from the earmarkings to the contingency reserve, which amounted to 10 per cent of project earmarkings.
- 19. At its third session, the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme requested me to prepare and submit to its fourth session a detailed study of future contingency reserve requirements in the light of the suggestion by members that the 10 per cent level might exceed current or foreseeable needs. Such a study was presented to the fourth session (LP/SF/L.13), which recommended a retroactive reduction of the level of contingency earmarkings from 10 per cent to 8 per cent. The Governing Council decided to accept this recommendation 6/ and thereby released approximately \$14,400,000 from the reserve established for projects approved through the third session.
- 20. Schedule 7 shows that total excess allocations, including completed projects, were \$44,188,744. This amount represents 4.8 per cent of total earmarkings, \$908,659,287, issued by the Governing Council and indicates that the ceiling on the permissive excess of allocations over earmarkings has been observed.

Administrative Budget of the UNDP secretariat

- 21. The budget estimates for the year 1968 were submitted to the fifth session of the Governing Council (DP/L.54). The Council approved the estimates totalling \$16,972,700 and, in order to finance these requirements, authorized the issue of allocations of \$10,862,528 and \$6,110,172 from the resources of the UNDP (SF) Account and the UNDP (TA) Account respectively. 7/
- 22. At its sixth session, the Governing Council authorized me to issue additional allocations totalling \$167,200 to finance (a) from 1 July 1968, five industrial development adviser posts, together with the necessary support services, at a cost of \$76,700 8/ and (b) a study of the administrative capacity of the UNDP to deal with a larger programme ("capacity study") at a cost of \$90,500. 9/ The total supplementary allocations of \$167,200 were to be financed in the amounts of \$107,008 and \$60,192 from the resources of the UNDP (SF) Account and UNDP (TA) Account respectively.
- 23. Total allocations received towards the administrative budget of the UNDP secretariat, as shown in statement III and schedule 8, were therefore \$17,139,900; \$10,969,536 from the UNDP (SF) Account and \$6,170,364 from the UNDP (TA) Account. The total obligations incurred against these resources (exclusive of the operating costs of field offices payable by Governments of \$2,567,755) were \$17,109,822. Unobligated resources of \$30,078, plus other income of \$142,946, a total of \$173,024, were surrendered to the two components of the United Nations Development Programme.
- 24. Schedule 8 reveals that section 2 (travel and transportation) and section 4 (other general expenses) were over-encumbered by \$64,456 and \$152,277 respectively. In accordance with the decision of the Governing Council when it approved the original budget estimates that "the Administrator may transfer credits between sections only with the authorization of the Governing Council, such authorization to be obtained, if necessary, by canvassing members through correspondence", 10/I requested, by notes dated 31 December 1968 and 26 March 1969, the approval of members of the Council to transfer funds from section 1 (personal services) and section 3 (permanent equipment) to cover these deficits. All members who replied consented to the transfer.
- 25. During 1968, an ex gratia payment of \$1,238 to a local staff member in the Sudan was approved. The details of this payment have been provided to the Board of Auditors.

United Nations Development Programme Revolving Fund

- 26. During 1968, the level of the Revolving Fund was increased from \$7,500,000 to \$8,500,000 by virtue of Governing Council decisions taken at its fifth and sixth sessions. These decisions were (a) to increase the earmarking to finance SF preparatory activities from \$1,000,000 to \$1,500,000, an increase of \$500,000 $\frac{11}{2}$ and (b) to increase the earmarking to finance SF preliminary operations from \$2,000,000 to \$2,500,000, an increase of \$500,000. $\frac{12}{2}$
- 27. Statement IV, which summarizes the 1968 operations of the Revolving Fund, shows that the unencumbered balance of the Fund at 31 December 1967 was \$1,537,872, that resources of \$5,531,183 were returned to the Fund, and that \$1,000,000 was received from the Special Fund component in accordance with the Governing Council decisions cited in the previous paragraph. Against these total available funds of \$8.069,055, allocations of \$7,025,770 were issued leaving a balance of \$1,043,285 available for allocation at 31 December 1968.
- 28. The costs of preparatory assistance missions authorized in connexion with the appraisal and preparation of government requests for Special Fund assistance which did not materialize in approved projects amounted to \$178,273 and were charged to the Special Fund Account. The allocations issued for those missions were withdrawn and the actual costs were applied against the earmarking of \$180,000 approved by the Governing Council for this purpose. 13/

Projects financed from technical assistance contingency allocations and executed by the Administrator

29. During 1968, I executed, for the first time, technical assistance contingency projects. Statement V shows that against allocations of \$37,000 issued for this purpose, obligations of \$33,861 were incurred, leaving a balance of \$3,139 which will revert to the UNDP (TA) Account in 1969.

- II. REPORT OF THE BOARD OF AUDITORS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE UNDP ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1968
- 1. The Administrator submitted for audit the following five statements, supported by eight schedules:
- A. United Nations Development Programme (Technical Assistance) Account. Statement I. Status of income and allocations as at 31 December 1968.
- B. United Nations Development Programme (Special Fund) Account. Statement II. Status of income and allocations as at 31 December 1968.
- C. United Nations Development Programme Administrative Budget of the secretariat. Statement III. Status of funds as at 31 December 1968.
- D. United Nations Development Programme Revolving Fund. Statement IV. Status of funds as at 31 December 1968.
- E. United Nations Development Programme Projects financed from technical assistance contingency allocations and executed by the Administrator. Statement V. Status of funds as at 31 December 1968.

A. United Nations Development Programme (Technical Assistance) Account

- 2. As shown in statement I, the total amount available was \$79,825,387, mainly consisting of (a) net contributions pledged \$64,199,714, (b) local costs income \$4,110,432, (c) surrenders by participating and executing agencies \$1,016,588, (d) contributions received from Governments towards operating costs of UNDP field offices \$2,567,755, and the unencumbered balance as at 31 December 1967 \$7,356,726. During 1968, an amount of \$75,210,093 was earmarked mainly comprising (a) programme earmarkings \$63,556,007, (b) earmarking towards the administrative budget of the UNDP secretariat \$6,170,364, (c) operating costs of UNDP field offices payable by Governments \$2,567,755, and (d) restitution to the UNDP Revolving Fund of 1967 contingency allocations \$2,924,633. The unencumbered balance available at year-end thus amounted to \$4,615,294.
- There were unpaid prior years' pledges amounting to \$12,270,495 as at 1 January 1968. In 1968, new pledges amounting to \$64,570,314 were made. Collections during the year 1968 amounted to \$58,358,935, leaving a balance of \$18,481,874 outstanding at year-end.
- 4. Occasionally UNDP has sent missions and consultants to Special Fund projects to review project activities, on the understanding that the expenditure involved in the dispatch of such missions would be apportioned to projects as direct costs.
- 5. It has been observed that expenditure mentioned below, which was incurred during the years 1966, 1967 and 1968, has remained unapportioned to the relevant projects:

- 6. The Board understands that UNDP now proposes, following a suggestion from External Audit, to undertake a quarterly review of all such charges with a view to securing their timely adjustment.
- Purchase of vehicles from UNDP funds out of unutilized amounts resulting from the non-recruitment of experts. The basic principles governing the administration of UNDP Technical Assistance projects allocate the responsibility of provision of local transport for project personnel, supplies and equipment to the Government of the country where the project is located. In exceptional cases, where some Government is unable to provide such transport, this service can be charged to the project budget, provided detailed justification for departure from normal practice is established and a separate and clearly identifiable provision in the project budget is given. A number of cases, particulars of which have been supplied to the Administration, came to the Board's notice, in which project plans originally contemplated supply of local transport by host Governments, but subsequent occurrence of savings in project budgets, for various reasons, such as delayed recruitment of experts or fellowship holders, was made the occasion for procurement of vehicles, cars and other transport not originally included in the project plans. The UNDP has stated that action in these cases may have been prompted by some misunderstanding and, for the future, have assured the Board that existence of savings would not qualify as a factor relevant to a d cision for purchasing transport not previously contemplated in project plans.

B. United Nations Development Programme (Special Fund) Account

- 8. During 1968, the Governing Council approved 151 new projects for an aggregate amount of \$141,284,200. After taking into account the earmarkings withdrawn in 1968 for cancelled projects, the cumulative total of projects approved numbered 925 and the amount earmarked for these projects totalled \$908,659,287. The allocations issued by the Administrator to the executing agencies for approved projects through 31 December 1968 amounted to \$804,222,339. Remittances to the executing agencies totalled \$477,877,038.
- 9. As at 31 December 1968, the field work on 240 projects involving an amount of \$183,928,271 earmarked by the Governing Council had been completed. This figure does not include twenty-four cancelled projects and two projects which were completed earlier, but were revived in 1968. Out of the 240 projects completed up to 31 December 1968, the accounts of 132 had not been closed, although the basic agreement between the Special Fund and executing agencies provides for closing of project accounts as soon as possible, but normally within twelve months after the completion of the programme of work. Seventy out of the 132 projects awaiting closure of accounts were completed before 31 December 1968. Timely closing of accounts of projects and elimination of balances relating to completed projects is desirable for the purpose of meaningful presentation of figures in the Special Fund statements and schedules. The Board would suggest institution of suitable measures to avoid delay in closing project accounts in future.
- 10. Contributions pledged amounting to \$202,833,750 were outstanding as at 31 December 1968, out of which a balance of \$40,269,681 was due for 1968 and prior years, and the remaining amount of \$162,564,069 was in respect of future years 1969 through 1971.

- 11. The amount of \$21,116,423 represents the balance due in respect of government obligations for local operating costs in respect of projects. This balance comprised \$3,608,690, which was due in respect of 1968 and prior years, and \$17,507,733 in respect of future years' obligations.
- 12. The following projects were undertaken, but they were abandoned later, with the result that expenditure incurred on them turned out to be infructuous:
- (a) Petroleum Institute in Argentina. A project for the establishment of a petroleum institute in Argentina was taken up by the Special Fund, in August 1962, but it was cancelled six years later in June 1968 because of the reported inability of the Government to take certain actions devolving upon it under the plan of operation. An earlier action to cancel could have saved a substantial portion of the expenditure incurred, amounting to \$96,784, apart from releasing the earmarking of \$1,110,100 which remained blocked. We are informed that the UNDP took a period of six years in cancelling the project in the hope, based on repeated kindling of interest in the project in government circles, that it would ultimately become operative. The Board has noted, however, that the Special Fund consultant for the project, as well as the project manager, had repeatedly submitted reports expressing their doubts about the possible implementation of the project in general and highlighting the factors which ultimately led to its cancellation. In the circumstances, the Board feels that in view of the Government's known difficulties and adverse comments of UNDP experts, the decision to cancel the project could perhaps have been taken earlier.
- (b) Development of the gold deposits at the Tipuani area, Bolivia. A project for the development of gold deposits at the Tipuani area in Bolivia was taken up by the Special Fund in August 1966, but it was cancelled after two years for the reasons, firstly, of the Government's inability to meet its financial obligations with respect to local operating costs and cash counterpart contributions and, secondly, the raising of a claim by a private party to mining concessions in the project area. An expenditure of \$289,413 was incurred on the project. The fact that neither the Government nor the Gold Mining Co-operatives, which had agreed to share responsibility for the provision of counterpart support, were found in a position to do so, as well as the discovery of a mining concession, would seem to indicate some shortcomings in the process of evaluation of the project before its initial acceptance.

C. United Nations Development Programme administrative budget of the secretariat

13. The obligations incurred, excluding cost of field offices chargeable to Governments, amounted to \$17,139,900. These obligations were apportioned between UNDP (SF) and UNDP (TA) as under:

14. The cost of field offices charged to Governments amounted to \$2,567,755 as against \$2,246,555 in the year 1967.

- 15. Payment of rental subsidies for Resident Representatives and other staff. The Consultative Committee on Administrative Questions (CCAQ), in their report of April 1964, considered the situation where a substantial number of staff benefited from housing provided by a Government or an organization at reasonable rates, while other staff in the same area were required to obtain housing commercially at rents substantially higher than their colleagues. concurred in the proposal of the Technical Assistance Board that, in such situations, an arrangement should exist by which staff paying the substantially higher rents should receive an appropriate subsidy. The UNDP administration has also been allowing payment of rental subsidies to certain Resident Representatives who are posted in countries in which the considerations weighing with the CCAQ do not apply for the reason that the post adjustment allowance is already based on normal rents of commercial housing. The Board feels that the payment of rental subsidies to Resident Representatives, as well as other staff of UNDP, is not covered by any of the existing provisions of the Staff Regulations and Rules and its continued payment would require regularization by incorporation of an appropriate provision in the Rules.
- 16. Grant of sabbatical leave on full pay. Staff Rule 105.2(a) provides that special leave with full or partial pay or without pay, may be granted for advanced study or research in the interest of the United Nations. A staff member was granted special leave for fifteen months with full pay, involving an expenditure of \$37,500, under a programme called "sabbatical leave to senior members of the UNDP field service". It was arranged that, while on special leave, the services of the staff member would be assigned to a university for study, research and writing, related to his experience and, in lieu of the benefits derived by it, the university would reimburse an amount of \$14,500 to UNDP. The arrangement, however, did not work satisfactorily. The university authorities reported after about five months that, while the staff member was deriving some benefit by attending some classes and seminars, he was not of any help to them as he was "a very sick man". The university also expressed its inability to share the costs. The "sabbatical" leave was, however, continued for the full fifteen months. The staff member is likely to retire at the age of sixty within less than two years of the date of completion of his sabbatical leave. It is therefore considered that the expenditure of \$37,500 was infructuous as it did not serve the interests of UNDP.

D. <u>United Nations Development Programme - Revolving Fund</u>

- 17. The earmarking to the Revolving Fund for Technical Assistance contingencies in 1968 remained, as in earlier years, at \$4.5 million, the earmarking for preparatory assistance missions was increased from \$1 million to \$1.5 million by the decision of the Governing Council at its fifth session (9-29 January 1968). The earmarking for preliminary Special Fund operations was also increased from \$2 million to \$2.5 million by the decision of the Governing Council taken at its sixth session (11-28 June 1968). As a result, the level of the Revolving Fund was raised from \$7.5 million to \$8.5 million during 1968.
- 18. During the year 1968, the Administrator issued allocations for an amount of \$7,025,770 as shown in statement IV. The unencumbered balance of the fund as at 31 December 1967 was \$1,537,872. During 1968, \$5,531,183 was reimbursed to the fund and \$1,000,000 was received from the Special Fund component for increase of the level of the fund. The available balance for allocation thus amounted to \$1,043,285.

E. United Nations Development Programme - projects financed from technical assistance contingency allocations and executed by the Administrator

19. The Administrator of UNDP executed for the first time during 1968, Technical Assistance contingency projects. Out of the allocations of \$37,000 issued during 1968, obligations amounting to \$33,861 were incurred and the unencumbered balance of \$3,139 will revert to UNDP (TA) during 1969.

20. <u>Contributions receivable</u>. The position of the arrears as at 31 December 1968 is indicated below:
