**Annex to the identical letters dated 16 May 2012 from the
Permanent Representative of Saudi Arabia to the United Nations
addressed to the Secretary-General and the President of the
Security Council**

We, the Permanent Representatives of the States members of the Cooperation Council of the Arab States of the Gulf to the United Nations, regret to call your attention to yet another flagrant interference by the Islamic Republic of Iran in the internal affairs of sovereign States members of the Council and of the United Nations. The recent statements by the Chair of the Islamic Consultative Assembly, Ali Larijani, and Husain Ali Shahryari, Member of Parliament, blatantly dismiss the ongoing endeavours by States members of the Council to enhance their cooperation through further steps of integration. Furthermore, the statements also clearly challenge the sovereignty and integrity of a State member of the Council, namely the Kingdom of Bahrain, by claiming the right to determine its political choices and affiliations in the matter under consideration.

It is most regrettable that Iran should persist in this aggressively hegemonic tendency in total disregard of the principles of the Charter of the United Nations, the basic rules of good-neighbourly relations between nations and the objectives and principles of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation. Such statements are reprehensible by all standards and represent a totally unacceptable conduct, in form as in substance.

We believe that the Islamic Republic of Iran would be well advised to fully comply with international norms and standards that govern relations between equally sovereign States, based on the ethical and legal foundations of international law. It is incumbent upon the Islamic Republic of Iran to take immediate action to prevent the recurrence of such unconstructive statements that run counter to the interests of the peoples of the region and will eventually undermine the security and stability of the region as the whole.
