Letter dated 4 December 1984 from the Permanent Representative of Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter of 27 November 1984 (A/39/695-S/16844), I have the honour to report to you two serious incidents of violation of Pakistan airspace and territory from the Afghanistan side on 1 December 1984. The details of the incidents are as follows:

On 1 December 1984, at 1000 hours (Pakistan Standard Time) six Afghan jet aircraft dropped 24 bombs around Arandu village in the Chitral district. Two of these aircraft also dropped two bombs and fired rockets in the vicinity of Kesu, 13 kilometres north of Drosh.

On the same day, at 1600 hours (Pakistan Standard Time), three Afghan aircraft intruded about 2.5 kilometres into Pakistan airspace at Imam Bostan in the Nushki area of Baluchistan.

I request Your Excellency to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 28, and of the Security Council.
