### Extensions of country programmes in the Arab States region

### Note by the Executive Director

#### Summary

The present note contains information on the six-month extension of the UNFPA country programme for Egypt, following a one-year extension of the programme in 2012.

In accordance with established procedures, the Executive Director approves the first one-year extension of a country programme, while requests for further extensions are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to approve the six-month country programme extension for Egypt, as indicated in table 1.

A new Government is not expected to be in place before July 2012. Therefore, the United Nations requested an additional one-year extension of the UNDAF and the country programme documents through December 2013. This request was based on political development and the need for sufficient time for consultation, to ensure alignment of the UNDAF and the country programme documents with the priorities and strategies of the new Government. However, the Government of Egypt agreed to a six- month extension, through 30 June 2013, rather than a one-year extension.
