

#### 2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

Following the confirmation or, as applicable, election of the officers, the expert group will adopt the agenda for its meeting and agree on the organization of work (see annex).

The provisional agenda for the meeting was prepared in accordance with Commission on Narcotic Drugs decision 53/2, on follow-up to the revised draft annual report questionnaire, and Commission resolution 52/12, on improving the collection, reporting and analysis of data to monitor the implementation of the Political Declaration and Plan of Action on International Cooperation towards an Integrated and Balanced Strategy to Counter the World Drug Problem.

In its decision 53/2, the Commission requested the Secretariat to prepare a revised version of the draft annual report questionnaire<sup>1</sup> taking into consideration the following:

- (a) The comments received from Member States prior to the fifty-third session of the Commission and contained in the conference room paper entitled "Revised draft annual reports questionnaire: comments received from Member States";
- (b) Any supplementary comments submitted by Member States prior to 20 May 2010;
  - (c) Other ongoing data-collection mechanisms.

The Commission also decided that the revised version of the draft annual report questionnaire should highlight any unresolved issues that might arise from contradictory comments.

# 3. Finalization of the content and structure of a revised, simple and efficient reporting system

The expert group will discuss the unresolved issues, if any, arising from the comments and will finalize the data-collection tools so that the Commission may consider for adoption the revised comprehensive data-collection tool at its reconvened fifty-third session, to be held on 2 December 2010. The revised draft annual report questionnaire is composed of the following four parts:

Part One. Legislative and institutional framework

Part Two. Comprehensive approach to drug demand and supply reduction

Part Three. Extent, patterns and trends in drug use

Part Four. Extent, patterns and trends in drug cultivation, manufacture and

trafficking

## 4. The way forward in improving data-collection and reporting processes

The expert group will discuss and prepare recommendations, for adoption by the Commission, on the mechanism for reporting data from the revised annual report questionnaire once it has been adopted by the Commission, taking into account that reporting to the Commission would include monitoring of (a) trends in drug consumption and supply; (b) adherence to the conventions; and (c) implementation of the Plan of Action.

In particular, the expert group should consider the mechanisms by which new data collected are to be reported to the Commission with regard to frequency of reports, analytical presentation and other guidelines the Commission may consider appropriate.

#### 5. Conclusions and recommendations

The expert group is expected to discuss the unresolved issues, if any, and finalize the data-collection tool developed as a result of its meeting held in January 2010 and comments received from the Member States.

Pursuant to Commission resolution 52/12, the expert group should submit to the Commission, for consideration and possible adoption at its fifty-third session, a revised set of data-collection tools and mechanisms for the collection, collation, analysis and reporting of data.

# 6. Adoption of the report on the meeting of the expert group

It is expected that the expert group will adopt its report containing conclusions and recommendations on 13 October 2010, the last day of the meeting.
