This is to express our profound gratitude and appreciation for the strong condemnation expressed by you of the unwarranted, senseless, offensive and provocative acts aimed at denigrating Islam under the garb of freedom of expression.

Like all Muslims of the world, Pakistanis cannot condone any act, writing or verbal attack on their beloved Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him) or their religion. I am attaching the resolution passed in this regard by the National Assembly of Pakistan (see enclosure). Moreover, Pakistan's Cabinet in its meeting has decided to observe Friday, 21 September 2012, as Youm-e-Ishq-e-Rasool, "Love for Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him)", and has declared the day a public holiday.

The non-Muslim members of the international community have the duty to prevent and penalize such incitement to violence, which, as is evident by the reaction, poses a clear threat to international peace and security.
